How to reference:

Topographic map (from the Map Library website)

Basic Form:

Author. *Map Title* [format]. Date of map creation. Scale. "Name of Site and/or complete Document". Posted: Date when posted. URL (accessed date).

Example:

Natural Resources Canada. *Brampton, 30M/12* [map]. 1994. 1: 50 000. "Brock University Map Library Topographic Maps of the Golden Horseshoe". Posted: October 9, 2007. http://www.brocku.ca/maplibrary/digital/Canmatrix/Canmatrix_images/WEBjpgs/30m12.jpg (accessed September 17, 2008).

Topographic map (from the Map Library collection)

Basic Form:

Author. *Title, number* [format]. Edition. Scale. Series title. Place of publication: Publisher, Date.

Example:

Centre for Topographic Information. *Trenton, 31 C/4* [map]. Edition 7. 1:50,000. Canada 1:50,000. Ottawa, ON: Natural Resources Canada, 2000.

Street map (paper)

Basic Form:

Author. *Title* [format]. Edition (if indicated). Scale. Place of publication: Publisher, Date.

Example:

MapArt Ontario. *Brampton- Alton, Bolton, Caledon, Georgetown, Orangeville* [map]. 1:25 000. Canada: MapMedia Corporation, 2005.

Map created from Google Maps website

Basic Form:

Author (if known). *Map Title* [format]. Date of data, if known. Scale, if known. Name of person who generated map; Name of interactive site used to generate map. URL (generated date).

Examples:

Map of St. Catharines [map]. 2008. Generated by John Doe; using Google Maps. <http://maps.google.ca/maps> (generated September 17, 2008).
