

# Seguin township council minutes

Seguin Township Council at its regular meeting March 20, provided permission to the Salmon Lake Ratepayers' Association (subject to approval of location by the Public Works Supt.) to construct signs on Township property requesting that motorists brake for snakes. Further, Council agreed that the Township would donate \$200. for this project.

As per the recommendation of the Public Works Superintendent. Council approved the Public Works Departmental 2000 Training-/Education Budget in the amount of \$7,020.

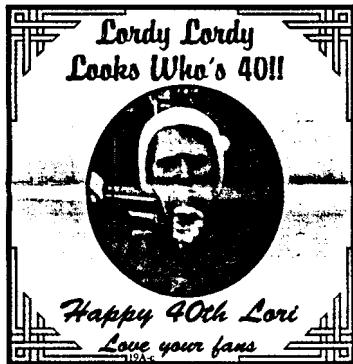
As per the recom-

mendation of the Public Works Superintendent, Council authorized the Public Works Superintendent to tender for the pulverization and stabilization of 5 kilometers of Rankin Lake Road.

Among other items of business, April 3, Council passed the following resolution: Whereas the Township of the Archipelago was not prepared to enter into an agreement with the Township of Seguin for the provision of passed Resolution No. 2000-75, a resolution to cease Emergency Response Services to the Township of The

Archipelago, until such time as the Township of The Archipelago enters into an agreement with the Township of Seguin for the contracting of these services; and whereas the Township of The Archipelago has

informed the Township of Seguin that the Township of The Archipelago has decided to enter into an agreement with the Township of Seguin for the provision of Emergency Response Services; continued on pg. 8

now therefore be it resolved that Seguin Township Council does hereby direct the Seguin Township Fire Department to resume Emergency Response Services into the southern portion of the Township of The Archipelago.

Council also resolved to reaffirm its support for Sound Municipalities to ask for an immediate meeting with the Minister of Health to request her intervention into the Ministry's latest review for co-location and to forthwith grant final project approval for Belvedere Heights redevelopment on its existing site; and further that the Ministry increase capital cost funding for beds to offset increased costs from

Council authorized the Treasurer to provide a funding advance to the Seguin Township Public Library Board on their 2000 municipal grant monies in the amount of \$10,000.

Council authorized the Reeve and CAO/Clerk to submit an ap-

plication to the Ministry of Citizenship, Culture and Recreation for funding under the Main Street Millennium Funding program. Available funding would be allocated as follows: 65 per cent to The Seguin Arts Council, "Seguin Millennium Mural" project and 35 per cent to the Township of Seguin Public Library Board "Foley Fall Fair Exhibit" project.

Council supported the application of Duck Lake General Store (David Arstad) for designation as an Agency Store by the Liquor Licensing Board of Ontario and as a lottery ticket outlet by the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario.

Council appointed Councillor Jim Swift as the Township of Seguin representative on the Advisory Committee for the Community Needs Assessment regarding a Nurse Practitioner for the Rosseau area of Seguin Township.

Stephen Duncan was appointed to the Township of Seguin Committee of Adjustment.

## Gas Projects

Doug French of Union Gas Limited addressed Council to provide an update on the projects Union Gas will be undertaking in the Township of Seguin over the next two years. Union Gas has scheduled the extension of the natural gas pipeline from the intersection of Hwy. 69 and 518 south along Hwy. 69 to Quebec Drive for the year 2000 and 2001, the construction of facilities in Orrville to provide the residents of Orrville with access to natural gas. Mr. French stated that all hookups are subject to 1999 rates and that some hookups will incur extra costs due to the amount of work required to provide the hookup such as blasting of rock or horizontal boring under roadways. Mr. French advised that he would investigate the Christie Fire Hall hookup and report back to Council.

Park-To-Park Trail Sarah Anderson and Gary King of the Park-To-Park Trail Committee and Jack Hoffman of the

mittee provided Council with an update of capital projects undertaken by the Committees to date as well as required future capital projects. The representative also provided Council with operating budgets for their Committees and defined the mandates of their Committees. Reeve Stivrins explained to the Committee representatives that Council would like to see any future requests for funding

from the Committees be presented to Council as one request for trails funding, the transfer of ownership of the trails systems to local governments as requested by Council. Sarah Anderson agreed to provide Council with statistics on projected revenues for area businesses from trail users to provide an estimate of the socio-economic spinoffs generated by the trail systems.
