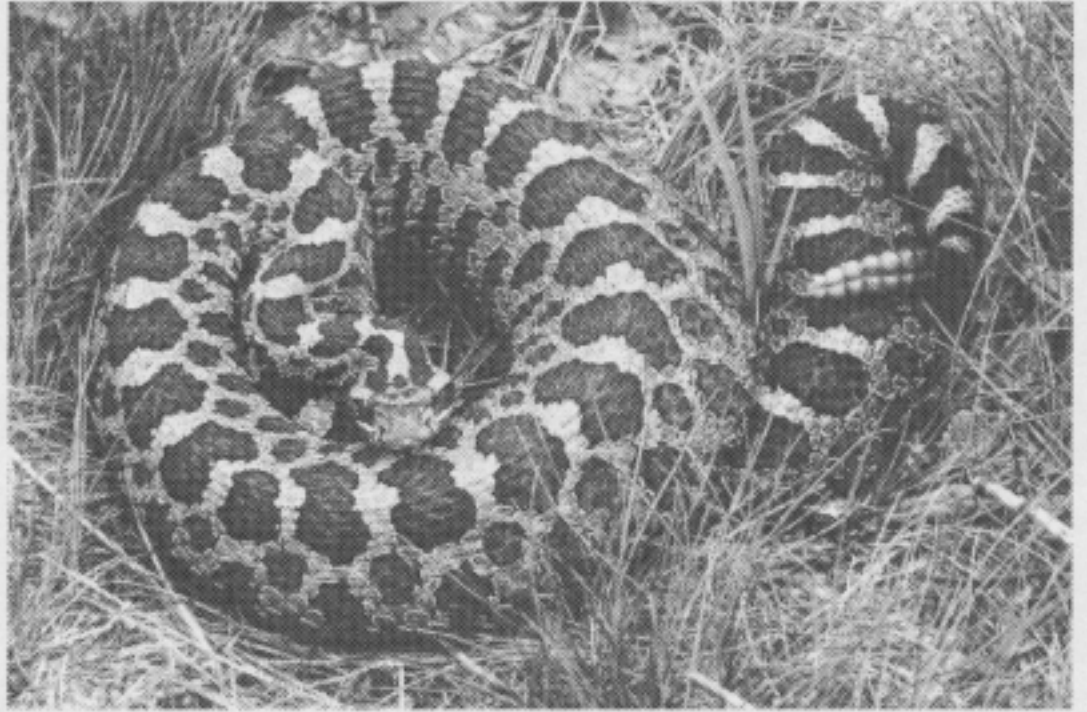
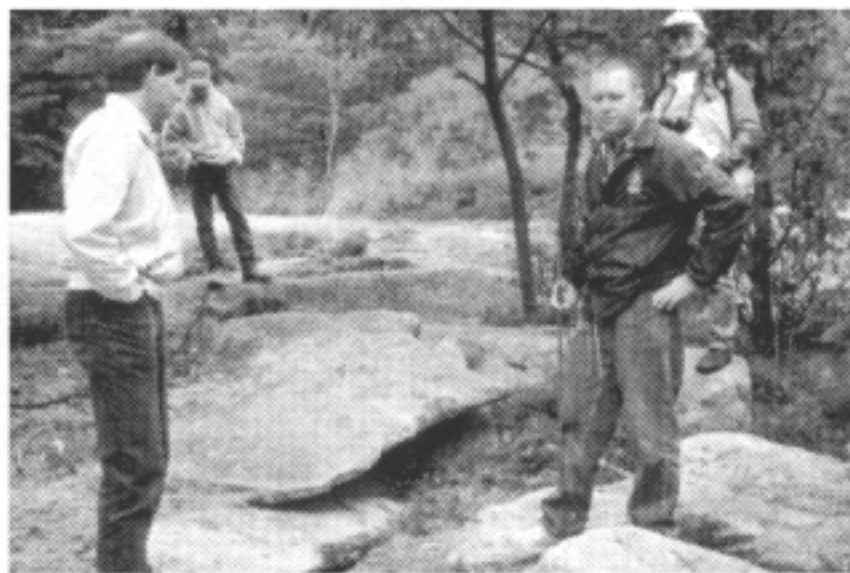

Field Trip and Symposium Participants

Our host, Chris Parent, leads the field trip to look at his Killbear Provincial Park study area. Chris points out rookery sites on the bare bedrock.



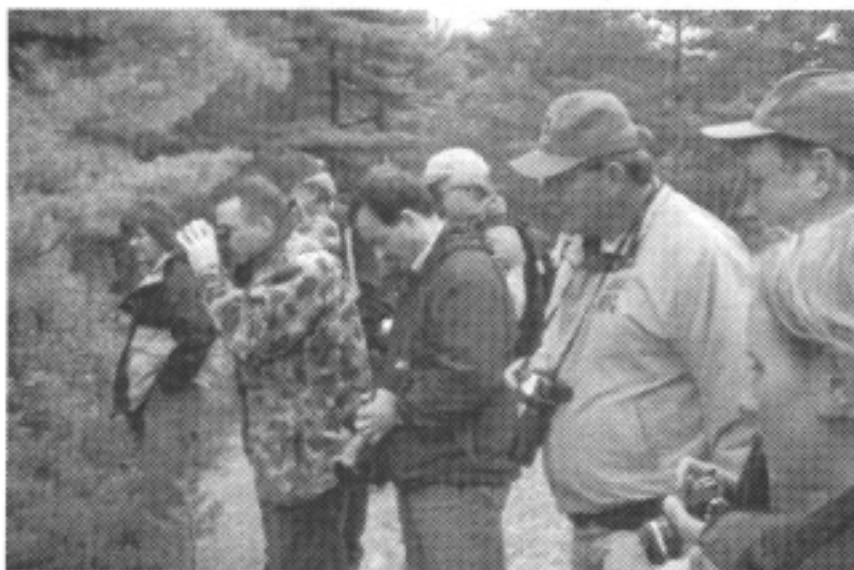
Rich Seigel and Goran Nilson examine a juvenile garter snake.
