HUMAN RESOURCES MANAGEMENT FOR THE NON-HUMAN RESOURCES MANAGER

Organizations today depend increasingly on their people to assist them in meeting business goals and maximizing efficiency and profits. While some organizations can afford the opportunity to have qualified HR professionals on staff, not all organizations are able to have dedicated HR professionals, and the burden of implementing appropriate human resources systems falls to managers and supervisors.

This seminar involves an explanation of some of the key requirements of effective HR as they fall under Employment Standards Act, Human Rights, Employment Equity, and Health and Safety, to name just a few relevant pieces of legislation that are important to effective development of HR programs. Some basic requirements pertaining to recruitment and selection, performance appraisals, discipline, and employee relations will be discussed. This seminar will be ideally suited to smaller organizations where there is no HR department, or where an individual is responsible for some aspects of HR.
