| 1. | Students wishing to proceed to year 2 as BPhEd majors must have achieved a minimum 65 percent major average, with a minimum 65 percent in KINE 1P88 and 1P93, a minimum 60 percent non-major average and a minimum 60 percent overall average. Students wishing to proceed to year 3 and year 4 as a BPhEd major must have achieved a minimum 60 percent major average, a minimum 60 percent non-major average and a minimum 60 percent overall average. Students not meeting the above requirements will be moved to the Bachelor of Applied Health (AGEN). See Academic Regulations regarding repeating courses. |
| 2. | Students should consult with the Department of Kinesiology regarding their program requirements.   |
| 3. | BPhEd majors must take a minimum of one elective credit outside the Department of Kinesiology.   |
| 4. | Students intending to pursue teacher certification upon completion of their degree should consult the Calendar entry for the Faculty of Education for the program admission requirements.  |
| 5. | BPhEd majors are required to have current emergency First Aid/CPR certification upon application to graduate.  |
| 6. | The following courses are considered experiential learning: KINE 1P90, 1P93, 1P98, 2F00, 2P02, 2P05, 2P90, 2P92, 3P00, 3P02, 3P03, 3P05, 3P06, 3P08, 3P10, 3P13, 3P14, 3P32, 3P80, 3P90, 3P91, 3P94, 3P98, 4F16, 4P00, 4P01, 4P02, 4P09, 4P10, 4P12, 4P13, 4P14, 4P16, 4P22, 4P32, 4P80, 4P82, 4P91, 4P93, 4P94, 4P86, 4P87, 4P88, and 4P89.   |
| 7. | Students are not eligible to enroll in more than 1.0 credit from KINE 4P86, 4P87, 4P88 and 4P89.   |
| 8. | In 20 credit degree programs a maximum of eight credits may be numbered 1(alpha)00 to 1(alpha)99; at least three credits must be numbered 2(alpha)90 or above; at least three credits must be numbered 3(alpha)90 or above; and the remaining credits must be numbered 2(alpha)00 or above.<br>In some circumstances, in order to meet university degree and program requirements, more than 20 credits may be taken.  |
