

KINE 4P80 CLINICAL PRACTICES IN ATHLETIC THERAPY

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KINE 4P80 is a course that is in high demand for its theoretical and practical applications. This course provides students with practical knowledge and clinical experience that they can use and apply in coaching and teaching. Additionally, this course is ideal for students who are interested in applying for health care professional programs. Space is limited to 22 students because of the clinical internship (10 hours per term) required in the Athletic Therapy Clinic.

Students must apply for admission to KINE 4P80 via email to nchimera@brocku.ca. Applications must be submitted as a single pdf file and are due by June 1st of the year you are applying. The KINE academic advisor will be given a list of all students accepted into the classes and if your name is on this list, you will be allowed to register for these classes. Please contact her for your status.

Please submit the following information as a single pdf file in order to apply: Letter of application, documentation of CPR certification and first aid, KINE 1P98 and 3P80 mark, documentation of any clinical based workshops that you have participated in, and any other relevant experience you may have volunteering with patients in a clinic, hospital, or Co -Op.

The letter of application should outline your interest and personal experiences related to sports injury management. Career goals, teaching experiences, experience with BSM and/or BSP, volunteer experience in a medical or therapy clinic, or any other related work experiences are also important to outline.

Please also include documentation regarding:

- Grade received in KINE 3P80 and your anatomy course e.g. KINE 1P98, HLSC 2F95 or HLSC 2P96 *
- First Aid and CPR Certificates *
- Clinical based workshops
- Other qualifications (lifeguard, ski patrol, wilderness survival, coaching, etc.)

*Must accompany your application

Requirements:

- Minimum 'B' grade in KINE 3P80
- A good understanding of anatomy
- Suitability to be supervised in a university medical clinic, based on lab/class performance and/or previous work.

Hard copies of applications are not accepted. Please email applications as a single pdf file to nchimera@brocku.ca.
