Credit System and Durations

What is a credit vs. a course? How many courses do I have to take each year? How much is each course worth? How long will a course last?

Each course at Brock is worth either a full credit or a half credit. Students typically take 5.0 credits each year. A combination of full credit courses and half credit courses can be combined to total 5.0 credits. All of the degrees offered from the Kinesiology Department – BPhEd, BKin, and BSc(Kin) – are 20.0 credit degrees.

- **FULL CREDIT** = 1.0 credit
 - Denoted by an 'F' (i.e. 'full credit') in the course code. E.g. FREN 1**F**90
 - Usually run for the entire Fall/Winter, beginning in September and ending in April
- **HALF CREDIT** = 0.5 credit
 - Denoted by a 'P' (i.e. 'partial credit') in the course code. E.g. KINE 2**P**08
 - Usually run for one term – a Fall term courses begins in September and ends in December; a Winter term course begins in January and ends in April

How long are the courses? When do they begin/end?

The Fall/Winter academic year at Brock begins in September and ends in April, and is divided into 3 possible terms, or 'durations'.

- **D1 = September – April** (aka 'Fall/Winter term')
 - Usually only full credit courses are scheduled for D1 (e.g. FREN 1F90)
- **D2 = September – December** (aka 'Fall term')
 - Usually only half credit courses are scheduled for D2 (e.g. KINE 2P08, KINE 3P10)
- **D3 = January – April** (aka 'Winter term')
 - Usually only half credit courses are scheduled for D3 (e.g. KINE 2P08, KINE 3P10)

Students should plan their Fall/Winter schedule to ensure that they are only taking 5 courses each term. See examples below:

How can I plan my courses?

Under your **Student Self Serve** in your portal there is a **Course Planning** feature. You can use this before registration opens to help plan your schedule. It will list the Course Code, Duration, Type of Course, Days and Times running as well as the Remaining Space available. If a class fills it will show you so you can plan an alternative ahead of time.

IF YOU ARE UNABLE TO TAKE IT IN THE SPRING SUMMER YOU CAN PLAN ON TAKING IT IN YEAR 3 OF YOUR PROGRAM. **FOR THIS YEAR YOU CAN TAKE ONE OF KINE 2P85 OR 2P95 AND ONE OF KINE 2P91 OR 3P70**, THESE ARE REQUIRED COURSES FOR YEAR 3 OF YOUR PROGRAM AND WILL "MAKE ROOM" FOR KINE 2F00 IN YEAR 3.
- KINE 2P05 WILL ONLY BE RUNNING IN D3 (WINTER TERM) AND ANOTHER SECTION WILL RUN IN THE SPRING TERM AS WELL.

- a minimum 60% overall average

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- KINE 3P03 AND KINE 3P06 WILL NOT BE RUNNING THIS YEAR. BOTH SHOULD BE AVAILABLE NEXT YEAR. IF YOU WANT TO TAKE ONE OF THESE TWO TO YOUR REQUIRED ACTIVITY CREDIT YOU CAN TAKE AN ELECTIVE THIS YEAR AND PLAN TO TAKE THE ACTIVITY CREDIT NEXT YEAR. KINE 4P13 (MEDITATIVE AND

MARTIAL ARTS) IS GOING TO RUN IN D3. YOU ARE ABLE TO USE THIS COURSE TOWARD YOUR THRID YEAR ACTIVITY CREDIT.

- The 1.5 credit in electives at the 3P90+ level can be taken from within the Kinesiology Department (i.e. KINE courses) or outside of the Kinesiology Department. These electives can be taken from any combination of full (1.0) and half (0.5) credit courses. Students must successfully complete a minimum of 3.0 credits at the 3a90+ level in order to meet the requirements for graduation. Note that required courses (e.g. KINE 4P93) do count towards this requirement.
- A maximum of 8.0 credits at the year 1 level (1P00-1P99) can be counted towards your degree requirements in order to graduate. Your electives can be taken at any level however you should review your student record to ensure that you have not exceeded this limit.

- **KINE 3P90+:** You are required to take a 1.5 credits course within KINE at the 3P90+ level. This can be achieved by taking any combination of full credit (1.0) and half credit (0.5) courses. Any KINE course between 3P90-4P99 that is not a required course for the BKin program can be used to satisfy this requirement.
- **KINE 3P99, KINE 4P99, KINE 4F90, KINE 4F91:** You can apply for one or more of these Independent Study/Thesis courses with the Faculty member (i.e. Instructor) of your choice. Registering for your courses is done online through your **Brock Portal**. Your Brock Portal is the hub where all information about your student record is kept.

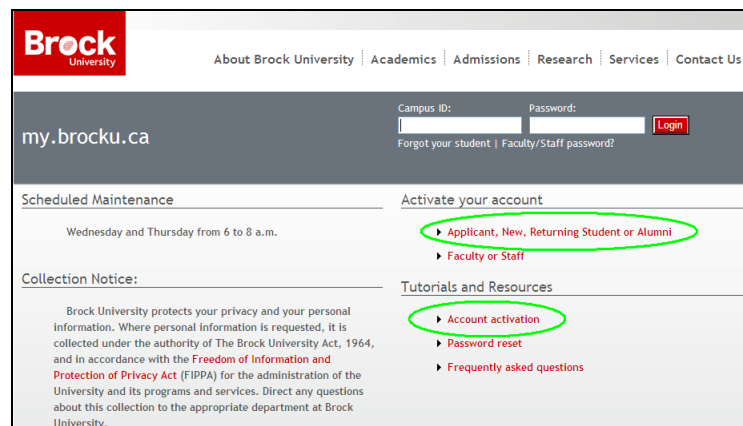

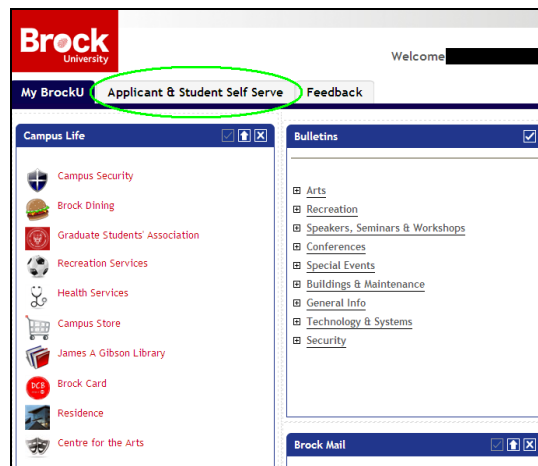

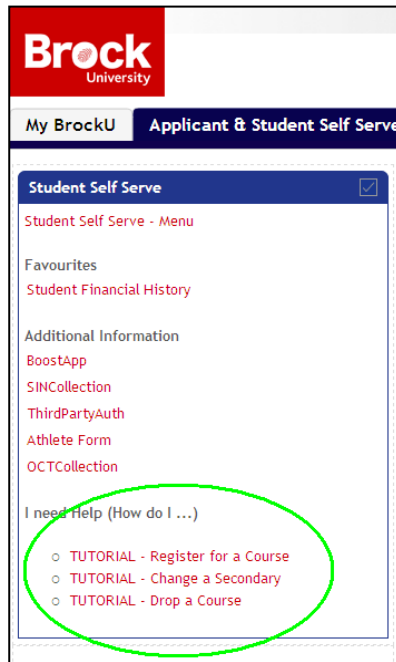
If it is your first time visiting your Brock Portal you will need to activate your account by clicking *Applicant, New, Returning Student or Alumni* under the *Activate your Account* section. For a step-by-step guide on how to activate your account click on the *Account Activation* under the *Tutorials and Resources* section.



Once you have entered your Campus ID and your password and logged in, click on the *Applicant & Student Self Serve* tab along the top of the screen.



The online tutorials under the *Student Self Service* area will show you exactly how to register for a course, change a secondary component (e.g. lab/ tutorial/seminar), and how to drop a course.



When can I register?

Your registration date is based on the number of credits you have accumulated as of **June 30, 2020**. You can determine the number of credits you've accumulated under the *Program Status* section in your Brock Portal. This is also where you can determine your Program Requirement Year which dictates which Undergraduate Calendar year you must follow for your degree requirements (see the *Program Requirements* section of this Guide).

Registration is a first-come-first-serve process. Courses can and have been known to fill before the end of the registration period. **It's strongly recommended that you register for your courses on the first day that the registration system opens to you.** The registration system opens at 6:00am.

Registration in KINE courses are 'reserved' for students in our degree program(s) for most of the registration period. For example, registration in KINE 2P09 is initially reserved for all BPhEd, BKin and BSc(Kin) students as it is a requirement for all three programs. However, KINE 2F00 is initially reserved only for BPhEd students as it is only a requirement for this one program (BKin and BSc(Kin) students must wait until registration opens to non-majors to try to register for this course). On dates later in the registration period the majority of KINE courses will open to non-majors. To determine the date registration in a specific course will open to non-majors please refer to the 'Notes' column on the online Timetable. Please note that registration opens at 6am but restrictions come off at midnight. You would need to log on and register for a course that had a restriction at midnight (12am). Once a course is full it is very unlikely that any additional spaces will be added. **It is your responsibility to make sure that you register in the courses you need.** The Academic Advisor cannot register for you.

What courses should I register for?

Check the *Program Requirements* section of this Guide for information on which courses you should select based on your program and year.

What if a lecture/seminar/tutorial/lab for a REQUIRED COURSE is full?

If a lecture/seminar/tutorial/lab is full choose another section if one available. Once you have registered for the course you can then keep checking your Brock Portal for scheduling updates to see if any spaces open up in the section you prefer.

If the course is a **MAJOR REQUIREMENT** (e.g. KINE 2P05, KINE 3P08, KINE 3P10, etc.) and on a **WAITLIST** please add yourself to the waitlist and check your Brock email regularly for contact from the Kinesiology Advisor.

Please be aware that if a required course is full there are likely many students in the same situation as you. We will take care of this situation as best we can, however this sometimes takes time.

Please be patient. **ONLY EMAIL THE ACADEMIC ADVISOR ONCE WITH YOUR CONCERN.** (see the *Academic Advisor* section for contact information).

What if a lecture/seminar/tutorial/lab for a NON-REQUIRED COURSE (elective) is full?

If the course is an elective start by selecting another elective that has space available. Once you have registered for the alternate course you can then keep checking your Brock Portal for

scheduling updates to see if any spaces open up in the course you prefer. If space opens up register for your preferred course and then immediately drop the alternate course you are currently registered in.

There are many KINE course that are not required in any of the three degree programs in the Kinesiology Department but are offered as electives to all BPhEd, BKin and BSc(Kin) students provided they meet the prerequisites. Also, some students choose to take KINE courses that are not a requirement for their degree as electives. If you have decided to take a KINE course that is not a requirement for your degree program it is considered an elective. (If you are trying to take all KINE course this year see the *Why isn't the system allowing me to register in all KINE courses?* section of this Guide for more information). If a KINE course you are taking as an elective is full you may have to take it next year and choose a different elective this year instead. Additional spaces are not usually added to these courses.

If an elective in another department is full or on a waitlist, contact the Academic Advisor in the appropriate department. **The Kinesiology Academic Advisor cannot assist you with courses in other departments.** A list of the Academic Advisors in other department at Brock is available at:

Restriction: open to BKin, BPhEd, BPhEd (Honours)/BEd (Intermediate/Senior), BPhEd (Honours)/BEd (Junior/Intermediate) and BSc (Kin) majors until date specified in Registration guide. Students must have a minimum of 8.0 overall credits.

Prerequisite(s): **KINE 2P05** or permission of the instructor.

Note: lab fee required; consult Department. Field experience is required. Transportation is a student responsibility. Modes of instruction/evaluation will normally include vigorous physical activity.

If you have not satisfied the prerequisites or met the restrictions for a KINE course you are not eligible to register in that course. If you register for a course for which you do not have the prerequisites **you will be automatically deregistered from the course.**

Please review the *Deregistration* section of the Registrar's website for additional information:

You will not be able to register in a D1 or D2 courses for which you do not have the prerequisites and/or have not completed the minimum number of credits.

- KINE 4P89 Clinical Internship in Kinesiology

KINE 3P99, 4P99, 4F90, 4F91: These are **Independent Study/Thesis** courses that require permission from the Instructor. For more information see the *What if I want to do an Independent Study course or Thesis?* section of this Guide. It is your responsibility to contact a Faculty member(s) who you are interested in working with to determine if they are able to supervise your Independent Study/Thesis. You should contact Faculty members who work in an area of research/study that interests you and that you are interested in exploring for an Independent Study. Once you have found a Faculty member willing to supervise you for an Independent Study/Thesis you must complete the application form in consultation with the Faculty member. The completed application (which must include your signature and the Faculty member(s)' signature) must be submitted to the Undergraduate Coordinator/Academic Advisor – Katrina Bennie – to be processed and signed by the Chair of the Department. Once your application has been processed you will be notified by email that an override for the course has been entered for you. **You must register for the course through your Brock Portal once the override has been entered.** The application form is available by contacting the Academic Advisor at kinadvisor@brocku.ca.

KINE 4P89: This is an **Internship in Clinical Kinesiology** that requires permission from the Instructor, a major average of 75% and a placement (that the student must find) of 50 hours in a

clinical setting under the supervision of a Health Professional. For more information see the *What if I want to do an Independent Study course or Thesis?* section of this Guide. It is your responsibility to contact a Faculty member(s) who you are interested in working with to determine if they are able to supervise your Internship. You should contact Faculty members who work in an area of research/study that interests you and that you are interested in exploring for an Internship. Once you have found a Faculty member willing to supervise you for an Internship you must complete the application form in consultation with the Faculty member and the Clinical Supervisor. The completed application (which must include your signature and the Faculty member(s)' signature and the Clinicians signature) must be submitted to the Undergraduate Coordinator/Academic Advisor – Katrina Bennie – to be processed and signed by the Chair of the Department. Once your application has been processed you will be notified by email that an override for the course has been entered for you. **You must register for the course through your Brock Portal once the override has been entered.** The application form is available by contacting the Academic Advisor at kinadvisor@brocku.ca.

KINE 4P80, 4P81: These are the **Clinical Practices and Assessments in Athletic Therapy** courses. Successful completion of KINE 3P80 (Care and Prevention of Injuries) is a prerequisite for these courses. To apply for KINE 4P80 and KINE 4P81 you must contact Nicole Chimera (nchimera@brocku.ca). If your application is accepted you will be notified by email that an override for the course has been entered for you. **You must register for the course through your Brock Portal once the override has been entered.**

KINE 4P82: This is the **Practicum in Athletic Therapy** course. A minimum final grade of 75% in KINE 3P80 (Care and Prevention of Injuries) is a prerequisite for this course.

What if I want to do an Independent Study course or a Thesis?

Independent Study and Thesis and Internship courses include:

- KINE 3P99
- KINE 4P99
- KINE 4P89
- KINE 4F90/4F91

These courses are designed to meet students' special academic interests in a topic/area of study in Physical Education and/or Kinesiology by completing independent work under the direction of a

Faculty member who has an interest or specialty in the same area. Course content and the evaluation protocol are determined individually between the student and Faculty member.

It is your responsibility to contact a Faculty member(s) who you are interested in working with to determine if they are able to supervise your Independent Study/Thesis.

These courses can either count towards satisfying requirements for courses at the 3P90+ level, or satisfying electives.

For BSc(Kin) students only: If you wish to have an Independent Study course count towards your Science Elective Credit requirements you must obtain permission from the Department before registering for the course. The content of the Independent Study/Thesis must be predominantly science based. Please notify the Undergraduate Coordinator/Academic Advisor that you wish to have the course considered as a Science Elective Credit when you submit your application.

For more information on how to apply for an Independent Study or Thesis see the *How do I apply for a course that requires the Instructor's approval?* section of this Guide.

What if I need to retake a class because I failed or dropped it last year?

To graduate with your BPhEd, BKin or BSc(Kin) degree you **must successfully complete (pass) 20.0 credits**. These credits are a combination of:

- i. Major required KINE courses
- ii. Context credits
- iii. Elective credits

When a course is repeated (e.g. taking KINE 1P90 a second time) the most recent grade will always replace the previous grade regardless of whether it is higher or lower than the previous grade. A course may only be repeated once.

- **FAILED/DROPPED MAJOR REQUIRED KINE COURSES:**

ALL specified major required courses must be taken and successfully completed (passed). If you drop or fail a major required course you must repeat the same course and pass it in order to satisfy the requirement.

- **FAILED/DROPPED NON-MAJOR COURSES (electives, context credits):**

If you fail or drop a non-major course (elective, context credit) you must either:

- a) Take the exact same course again and pass it;
- OR-
- b) Take another course(s) of equal credit value to replace it (e.g. if you need to replace a full credit course you can either take another full credit course or 2 half credit courses)

If you have failed a course and you choose not to repeat exactly the same course but rather choose to satisfy the requirement by taking a different course(s) the failed course grade will still factor into your average. The only way to not have a grade used in the calculation of your average is to **take exactly the same course again and pass it.**

What if I still need to complete a Context Credit?

You must select and successfully complete (pass) a Context Credit from the lists in the Undergraduate Calendar (see link below) before you will be permitted to graduate.

What if I have a timetable conflict (e.g. 2 courses scheduled at the same time each week)?

You cannot be in two places at once, therefore you should not be registered for two courses that are at the same time. Your grades will suffer, tests/midterms/exams may overlap and Professors are not supportive of this practice. This is NOT a good idea!!

Before registering for courses use the 2020-2021 Fall/Winter Timetable on the Registrar's website (<https://brocku.ca/registrar/guides-and-timetable>) to create a 'mock' schedule that is free of conflicts. Remember that full credit courses (e.g. HLSC 1F90) run for the whole academic year (September-April), whereas half credit courses (e.g. KINE 2P08) only run from either September-December (D2) or January-April (D3).

You should try to create your 'mock' schedule well in advance of the date that the registration system opens to you to ensure that you are ready to select your courses as soon as the system opens.

Try your best to register for the course sections (lectures, labs, tutorials, etc.) that you plotted on your 'mock' schedule. However, if your preferred section is full register in another section that doesn't conflict with your other courses and still has spaces available. (See the *What if a lecture/seminar/lab is full?* section of this Guide for additional information).

If an elective course conflicts with a required course (e.g. KINE 2P05, KINE 3P10, etc.) then you have to choose a different elective, or choose a less desirable class time(s) to avoid the conflict.

DO NOT REGISTER FOR 2 LECTURES/SEMINARS/TUTORIALS/LABS, ETC. THAT ARE SCHEDULED AT THE SAME TIME, REGARDLESS OF WHAT THE COURSES MIGHT BE.

Why isn't the system allowing me to register in all KINE courses?

The registration system will only allow students to register in 9.5 credits from one department. Therefore you will not be able to register in all KINE courses. Students should try to have one 0.5 elective credit from outside the department each year. If you want to attempt to take all KINE credits you must obtain permission from the Dean of the Faculty. Permission for this will only be considered if you have completed all your Context Credits, first year required courses and electives. To request this email the advisor.

ONLY EMAIL THE ACADEMIC ADVISOR ONCE WITH YOUR CONCERN. BE SURE TO INCLUDE YOUR FULL NAME AND STUDENT NUMBER IN YOUR EMAIL.

What if I want to take more than 5.0 credits?

To request permission send an email to the Kinesiology Academic Advisor (kinadvisor@brocku.ca) outlining the number of credits you would like to register for, what your proposed schedule will be (i.e. simply which courses you plan to take in the Fall term and courses you plan to take in the Winter term), and why you are requesting to take more than the number of credits you have been preapproved for. Please note that permission is granted at the discretion of the Department and Faculty based on the number of credits you have successfully completed and your academic performance (grades) to date. Your email should be received at least 2 weeks prior to your registration date. **ONLY EMAIL THE ACADEMIC ADVISOR ONCE WITH YOUR CONCERN. BE SURE TO INCLUDE YOUR FULL NAME AND STUDENT NUMBER IN YOUR EMAIL.**

What if I want to take less than 5.0 credits?

The BPhEd, BKin and BSc(Kin) degrees are all 20.0 credit degrees. Generally students take 5.0 credits each Fall/Winter session for 4 years to complete their degree requirements to graduate. Please be aware that **taking less than 5.0 credits during the 2020-2021 Fall/Winter session may impact your degree progression (i.e. you may be required to stay longer at Brock beyond the 'traditional' 4 years in order to complete your degree requirements).** Additionally, some of the required KINE courses listed for your year of study are prerequisites for required KINE courses next year. You should check your program requirements in the appropriate Undergraduate Calendar to ensure that you are registering in the

KINE courses this year that are prerequisites for the required KINE course you will need to take next year.

You are welcome to take less than 5.0 credits in order to reduce your course load. Some students choose to take course(s) during the Spring/Summer session in order to 'catch up' or 'get ahead' if they take less than 5.0 credits during the Fall/Winter. As well, some students choose to complete their degree in more than the 'traditional' 4 years.

If you decide that you want to take less than 5.0 credits you do not need special permission or approval. Simply register for the number of credits that you wish to take during the 2020-2021 Fall/Winter session on your Brock Portal during the registration period. However, please keep the following in mind:

- **Student Status considerations (part-time vs. full-time status):**
 - Full time student: enrolled in 3.0 or more credits over the Fall/Winter session
 - Part-time student: enrolled in less than 3.0 credits over the Fall/Winter session.

The number of credits you enroll in can have a **SERIOUS IMPACT** on any government student financial assistance (e.g. OSAP), scholarships, or bursaries you have applied for/are receiving. If you have applied for/are receiving any type of student financial assistance you should contact the **Student Awards and Financial Aid Office** before you decide to register for a reduced course load.

What if I want to do a minor?

Requirements for Minor programs are listed by department in the Undergraduate Calendar. Please contact the Academic Advisor in the appropriate department for more information about their program and to determine how to declare a Minor. **The Kinesiology Department does NOT offer Minors.**

Do I have to apply to 4th year?

You do not have to apply to 4th year. The BPhEd, BKin, and BSc(Kin) are all 4 year programs.

What's the difference between an Honours degree and a 4-Year Degree? How do I get Honours?

There is no difference in the courses you are required to take in order to receive an Honours degree or a 4-Year degree in your program. The differences between these two degree are based solely on your grades:

- **Honours:** You will graduate with an Honours degree if on the day your last grade is entered you have:
 - a **MAJOR AVERAGE** of at least 70%;
 - a **NON-MAJOR AVERAGE** of at least 60%; and
 - an **OVERALL AVERAGE** of at least 60%

If you did not achieve one or more of these requirements you will not receive an Honours degree.

- **4-Year Degree:** You will graduate with a 4-Year degree if on the day your last grade is entered you have:
 - a **MAJOR AVERAGE** between 60-69.4%;
 - a **NON-MAJOR AVERAGE** of at least 60%; and
 - an **OVERALL AVERAGE** of at least 60%

If you have an issue and require her assistance please **EMAIL HER ONLY ONCE FROM YOUR BROCK EMAIL ACCOUNT. PLEASE INCLUDE YOUR FULL NAME AND STUDENT NUMBER IN YOUR EMAIL**. Emails that do not contain this information, or are not sent from a Brock email account will not receive a reply. During peak times it may take the Academic Advisor 10 business days to respond to your email. If you receive an automatic reply email from the Academic Advisor this is confirmation that she has received your email and it is in the response queue. Please read the automatic response email thoroughly (and this Registration Guide) to find answers to your questions or concerns.

During peak times (May-October) the Academic Advisor limits the number of in-person appointments available. Quite often your questions/concerns can be answered via email. If the Academic Advisor feels there is a need for an in-person appointment she will contact you via email.

What should I **NOT** contact the Academic Advisor about?

- **Issues with courses in other departments (i.e. non-KINE courses)**

For **international Bachelor of Education programs** visit the Career Services website or make a point to visit their information booths which are set up around campus throughout the year.

If you are interested in applying for a BEd program you will usually need to complete the requirements for 2 teachable subjects if you want to be qualified to teach at the Intermediate/Senior level (high school) and 1 teachable subject if you want to be qualified to teach at the Junior/Intermediate (middle school) level. If you wish to apply for the Intermediate/Senior level you will usually need to complete 5.0 credits in your first teachable subject and 3.0 credits in your second teachable subject. Although the requirements for a second teachable can be achieved by taking a minor, you do not necessarily have to complete a minor to earn these 3.0 credits. This can be achieved by taking the appropriate courses as electives to fulfill the admission requirements for your second teachable (refer to the TEAS website). If you wish to do a minor refer to the *What if I want to do a minor?* section of this Guide. **If you have questions about meeting the requirements for a teachable subject you should contact the Faculty(ies) of Education that you plan to apply to.**
