2022/4 - 2022/8	Parental, Brock University I took a brief maternity leave on April 2022 when my son was born. At this time there was not much impact on my research developments as my team has a research coordinator that was able to continue data collection during my leave and I was able to review submitted articles and complete revisions on those during my leave. The main impact was on my ability to attend Conferences and present my research. I attended two Conferences online (International Transplant Nurses Society Annual Meeting and the Canadian Donation and Transplantation Research Program Annual Meeting), one in person the Canadian Association of Critical Care Nurses Dynamics 2022, and my research coordinator presented on my behalf at the Transplantation Society Meeting.
2019/8 - 2020/8	Parental, Queen's University at Kingston I had a baby in August 2019 and returned from maternity leave in August 2020. Prior to this, my methodological approach was novel and created delays at each of the three sites. My thesis proposal was approved in September 2017 and ethics approval obtained at my primary site in December 2017, but establishing a data-sharing agreement delayed data collection by eleven months (December 2018). For the remaining two Ontario sites, I completed the Clinical Trials Ontario Streamlined Research Ethics Board for observational studies, which took an additional four months to complete (April 2019). Data collection was approved at site 2 in June 2019 just I was nine months pregnant and advised by my obstetrician not to travel. Data collection at site 3 was further delayed as the site wanted to establish a data sharing agreement, which took another 8 months to be signed, delayed data collection until December 2019.
