Department of Recreation and Leisure Studies

The **Degree Completion for Professionals** program is designed for working professionals exploring options to complete a degree for career advancement or pursue further credentials.





Degree Obtained

The degree completion program is built to support professionals in obtaining the Bachelor of Recreation and Leisure Studies (3-year pass degree).

Students can pursue the 4-year BRLS with a concentration in Therapeutic (TR) or Community Recreation (CR), but this will require further on-campus and in person coursework.

Admission Requirements

To be eligible for this unique opportunity students must have the following:

- A two-year diploma in Recreation and Leisure Services or Recreation Therapy with a cumulative 75% or higher average. Students may be prior graduates of any college or university.
- 2. Three years of full time (or a minimum of 6000 hours of part time) paid, non-seasonal employment in a recreation related profession. Students pursuing the BRLS with concentration in TR must have 6000 hours working in Therapeutic Recreation.
- 3. Current employment in a recreation related profession.

Duration

The timeline to graduation depends on the degree option selected and the number of college transfer credits awarded to the student. Students pursing the 15 credit BRLS can expect 6 to 8 terms of study.

Program Entry

Courses are offered in three terms: Fall (September to December), Winter (January to April) and Spring/Summer (May to August). Students may enter the program in any term.

Classroom and Online Learning

Courses are scheduled in the following formats:

Online (fully synchronous or asynchronous), online blended (some synchronous and some asynchronous) or blended locations (includes both online and in-person course components).

The in-person components of your RECL courses would be offered at Brock University or in the GTA.

National Council for Therapeutic Recreation Certification

Students in the Therapeutic Recreation concentration graduate prepared to write the National Council for Therapeutic Recreation Certification (NCTRC) exam to become a Certified Therapeutic Recreation Specialist (CTRS).

Courses in Therapeutic and Community Recreation

Specific recreation courses are considered 'electives' for students working toward obtaining the pass degree and are requirements for students working toward the 20-credit degree with a concentration.

What to expect from the Degree Completion Program?

- Access to part time coursework in blended and online formats (e.g., less than three half-credit courses per term).
- Courses offered in three terms: Fall, Winter, and Spring/Summer.
- The timeline to graduation depends on the degree option and the number of transfer credits awarded to the student. Please find more information about transfer credit pathways from college by visiting brocku.ca/admissions/undergraduate/transfer-students/ pathways-and-agreements
- For students pursuing the 15 credit BRLS degree on a part-time basis, the approximate timeline to graduation is six to eight terms.
- For students pursuing the 20 credit BRLS degree on a part-time basis, the approximate timeline to graduation is eight to ten terms.
- Part time students are eligible for student awards and can apply for OSAP.



Application Process

The Recreation and Leisure Studies department will verify your professional experience first.

Once accepted to the professional pathways program, follow the process for transfer student applications directly to Brock University (there is a fee associated with the application). At this stage your college credits would be assessed, and any applicable credits would be applied to your course load.
