Final Assignments

One thing that will most likely be on the mind of every student are final assignments. These final assignments can be worth a significant portion of their grade. With these final assignments potentially happening across multiple courses, it is very important for students to be aware of when they are due and set out ample time to complete them. Making a plan and scheduling early can go a long way to ensure everything gets done on time!

Exams Schedule

Final exams may feel stressful as they are often high-stakes and can be worth a lot of the final grade. The exam schedule has now been released and students can check this in their my.brocku.ca portal, by clicking 'Student Exam Schedule.' Brock's Learning Services has many tools to support students to create a solid study schedule including a Five Day Study Plan Workbook. Encourage your student to talk to their professor or TA and ask questions to prepare.

Due Dates

A staple of finishing a semester is having many upcoming due dates. Support your student by encouraging them to make a list or calendar detailing all upcoming due dates, assignments, and exams. This will allow students to stay on track and get things in on time! Although, if your student feels they are not able to meet a deadline, they should contact their professors as soon as possible. Details regarding extension procedures are located in course syllabuses.

- Encourage Time Management: With deadlines approaching, encourage students to create a study schedule to stay on track.
- Support Self-Care: November can be intense, so remind them to take breaks, stay active, and get enough rest to maintain focus and well-being.

- December 19 Final Day of Exam Period


Residence Move Out: Students are required to move out of residence no later than 12 noon of the day following their last exam.

Messages from the Office of the Registrar:

- The my.brocku.ca student portal will be temporarily frozen for enrollment reporting to the Ministry of Colleges and Universities.
- This freeze typically lasts for the first 10-15 days of November and February.
- This will affect:
 - Processing of registration, course adds/drops/withdrawals, and fee assessments.
 - Financial Assessment / Refund request processing, including any adjustments to fees resulting from course changes, will be on hold until the freeze is lifted.

Academic Advising Support

Drop-in Advising: This service is offered Monday through Thursday from 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m., with no appointment required. Students can simply stop by the main Thistle corridor near the doors to Alphie's Trough to get assistance from the advising team.
