- Media: Suresh Doss, food writer and publisher of the website Spotlight Toronto, who has been instrumental in promoting VQA wines especially through social media
- LCBO: Orest Poluch, a LCBO product consultant in Guelph, ON works tirelessly on promoting Ontario VQA wines to his clientele.
- Hospitality: Jeremy Day, owner of Toronto's Café Taste, which serves a wide selection of VQA wines focusing on the most unique wines this province has to offer.
- Education: Christopher Waters, editor of Vines Magazine and continuing education educator at Brock University, who has a knack for sharing his knowledge of VQA wines in interesting ways and in real life settings.
- Promoter at Large: Bill Redelmeier, owner of Niagara-based Southbrook Vineyards, who has put Ontario VQA Chardonnay on the map through his organization of The Seriously Cool Chardonnay tasting in London, UK.
- Lifetime Achievement: Billy Munnelly, wine writer who for the past 20 years devoted himself to educating the public about Ontario wines in practical ways.

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
