History of Brock University

Opened in 1964, Brock University is named for Major-General Sir Isaac Brock, who died in battle at nearby Queenston Heights in the War of 1812. Brock's final words were said to have been "Push on, my brave fellows!" A Latin translation of this is "Surgite!" — which is Brock University's motto.

The seeds of the University were sown long before the doors first opened. Brock's story is about a community that rose up and built the institution it wanted for its future.

In the late 1950s, there was growing public discussion about how Niagara should have its own university. The grassroots sentiment became a movement in 1957 when the Allanburg Women's Institute asked the Ontario government to consider opening a university in the region.

By fall 1962, the Brock Founders Committee was incorporated. They received approval to create a new university, then developed an administrative and academic plan. Then they began raising money.

After years of meetings and fundraising, Brock opened in September 1964. It had 127 students in a refurbished refrigeration factory at the foot of the Niagara Escarpment in St. Catharines. In 1966, the landmark Brock Tower was completed, and Faculties began moving "up the hill" to the University's permanent home atop the Niagara Escarpment.

For the next 30 years, Brock sent thousands of graduates on to successful careers. It built a name for its personal quality of teaching afforded by attentive faculty and controlled class sizes. As the new millennium dawned, enrolment soared. Brock transformed from an undergraduate institute to a comprehensive University with flourishing research, graduate and doctoral programs.

The campus steadily expanded to keep pace with the demand for a Brock education with the construction of world-class research labs, a landmark fine arts complex, an international students' centre and a new research and innovation hub.

Brock serves its community as a cultural, academic and recreational centre, bringing excellent facilities to the people who created the University all those years ago. We are committed to building our community and fostering an environment that serves our students and our neighbours.

The modern university is the lineal descendant of the university of the Middle Ages. Its purposes and organization, even much of its ceremonial role, are medieval in origin.

Today's ceremony stems from the medieval tradition. The procession of the guild of teachers, whose solemn assembly, or Convocation, is the modern equivalent of the full congregation of all Faculties, is followed by the Chancellor and the Mace, the symbol of the University's corporate authority. The academic gowns, hoods and caps declare in their various designs and colours the academic qualifications of the faculty. The citations and presentations by the faculty to the Chancellor attest to the Chancellor and to society the degree of proficiency attained by the students of the University.

The Chancellor confers upon the students the appropriate degree. It is the act, not a certificate, which constitutes the validity of the degree bestowed. The statement "I admit you" and the placing of the students' hands within those of the Chancellor and his associates, bind the students to the University. They receive what the University has been and what it is today. The graduates are what the University hopes to be.



Ambearrister

An 'Ambearrister' was gifted to Brock University in 2020 by Dr. Cindy Blackstock, Director of First Nations Child and Family Caring Society (FNCFC). This bear, an extension of the 'Reconciliation Ambearrister' program, is an initiative and resource created by the Caring Society to address inequalities of Indigenous children, youth and families. Today, this program extends itself to uplift reconciliation efforts from all peoples, recognizing that if reconciliation is to take place it must reside within each and everyone. The program also acknowledges that reconciliation and "addressing discrimination takes love, honesty, compassion and a real commitment to helping others do the right thing" (FNCFC). Under the guidance of an Elder, Brock's 'Ambearrister' received their name: Entiohathé'te (It will be a bright road/path). Entiohathé'te is meant to help us move forward and do work that supports these words. More importantly, they encourage thought on how we can act on these words and make ideas and concepts surrounding reconciliation a reality at Brock University. Entiohathé'te will also be a gentle reminder for the University to commit to the Calls for Action offered by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.

Entiohathé'te's has found a home in The Phyllis Webstad Library located in Hadiya'dagénhahs First Nations, Métis and Inuit Student Centre.

The University flag

Our flag is the Banner of Arms of the Grant of Arms to Brock University, granted on March 17, 1965. The main feature on the flag is a gold-winged eagle with the book of learning on its breast. Yellow and red are colours associated with academic institutions and the eagle was once thought to be the bird that flew the highest and was the wisest.

The top the flag includes the maple leaf, representing Canada; a trillium representing Ontario and a shell (escallop)-a symbol long associated with the Lincoln-Welland Regiment and the County of Welland. The flag, donated by the members of Brock's 1994 Quarter Century Club, stands on the stage for each Convocation ceremony and is flown daily on campus.

The University mace

Maces were originally specialized war clubs, made of metal or garnished with metal spikes used by knights or other warriors.

This functional weapon evolved into a symbolic emblem of legislative and civic authority used by cities and towns and, ultimately, by parliament. Many universities have decorated maces as symbols of their corporate identity and authority.

Brock was presented with its mace in 1992 as a gift from the people of the Bailiwick of Guernsey, the birthplace of Major-General Sir Isaac Brock.

It is made of sterling silver and incorporates the Guernsey seal; the University crest; a crown from the Constable's baton; flames of learning from the University's coat of arms, a maple leaf, scallop shell and Trillium flower, which are symbols of the University; and a button from the uniform of Brock's 49th regiment.

A warm welcome from Brock University's Aboriginal Education Council

We at Brock University would like to acknowledge and honour the ancestors of those on whose traditional lands we gather today. Brock University is located on the shared lands of the Original Peoples, which became known as the traditional beaver hunting grounds. The Aboriginal Education Council and Brock University have worked collaboratively to keep the importance of our shared history, friendship and future relationships in our minds and hearts.

We would like to recognize the successes of our Indigenous graduates and all those graduating today.



Beta Gamma Sigma

Beta Gamma Sigma is the honour society serving business programs accredited by AACSB International — the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business.

Membership in Beta Gamma Sigma is the highest recognition a business student anywhere in the world can receive in a business program accredited by AACSB International. Brock received accreditation to AACSB in 2003, joining top international business schools, and in 2004 was admitted into Beta Gamma Sigma.

Membership in this honours society is offered only to the best business and accounting students: undergraduates completing third year in the top 10 per cent of their class and graduates ranking in the top 10 per cent of their undergraduate programs or top 20 per cent of their master's program.

Campus Wide Co-Curriculum

The Campus-Wide Co-Curriculum is a program designed to enhance the Brock student experience through the completion of activities and opportunities within 10 different co-curricular domains.

By completing the Campus-Wide Co-Curriculum, a student has made a meaningful investment in their holistic development and has demonstrated a significant commitment to continuous learning and personal growth. Students who complete the program are eligible to be inducted into the Isaac Brock Insignia Circle, a distinguished society of current students and alumni who are highly engaged in the Brock experience. This distinction is acknowledged by a red cord worn by the graduand.



Academic regalia

Academic regalia at Convocation is steeped in tradition. All participants wear gowns, which are reminiscent of the robes worn by monks or clergy in medieval times. Hoods, worn draped over the shoulders and back, are derivatives of the simple coverings worn by people of all classes to keep their heads warm in an inhospitable climate.

The Chancellor's gown is made from aegean blue silk and trimmed with gold lace. It is worn with a round velvet cap with a gold tassel. The Vice-Chancellor's gown is similar, but trimmed with silver. The University coat-of-arms is embroidered on the front facing of each gown. Honorary doctors wear gowns made of blue material with gold facings down the front and on each sleeve.

Faculty members wear the academic regalia appropriate to their degrees. Most doctoral gowns are more than one colour and many have three horizontal bars of velvet on each sleeve. Hoods signify the degrees and institutions from which they were received. Since Brock has faculty who graduated from scores of different universities, the Convocation procession is dramatic and colourful.

Brock's graduates wear aegean blue gowns and, after being admitted to their degrees, don distinctive hoods which identify them as graduates of our University. Made of scarlet viyella, the hoods are lined with navy blue and gold material. Three bars of navy blue are set against the gold in a manner that suggests a dress uniform that might have been worn by General Brock.

Honour cords

Honour cords are worn by graduands meeting the following criteria:

Graduands who have completed a 20-credit honours program with first-class honours standing, which requires a minimum 80 per cent average in all major credits and a minimum of 70 per cent in the remaining credits. As well, a transfer student must have completed a minimum of five credits at Brock University, including all departmental honours requirements for Year 4 and have maintained a minimum 75 per cent overall average and a minimum 80 per cent major average (based on Brock courses only).

or:

Graduands who have completed the approved 15-credit pass degree or 20-credit non-honours degree with a minimum 80 per cent overall average. Transfer students require a minimum 80 per cent cumulative average in all Brock courses and a minimum 80 per cent overall average.

Rosati is a leading and serving corporate director and has chaired many public company audit committees and nominating and corporate governance committees. Honorary Doctorate Recipient

Award-winning social entrepreneur Jenn Harper is the founder and CEO of Cheekbone Beauty Cosmetics INC., which aims to help every Indigenous person see and feel their value in the world while developing sustainable colour cosmetics that won't end up in a landfill.

An Anishinaabe woman and member of the Northwest Angle #33 First Nation in Kenora, Ont., Harper has struggled with accepting her Indigenous roots and was estranged from her Indigenous family for much of her life. After learning about her grandmother's experience in residential school, she came to understand how her family was affected by generational trauma.

Harper has been making a name for herself in the beauty industry for years but gained significant exposure after appearing on CBC's hit show **Dragon's Den** in 2019. She has since been featured as *Chatelaine's* **Woman of the Year in 2019**, and recognized in *Canadian Business's* **New Innovators List** and *Entrepreneur* magazine's **100 Women of Influence** list, both in 2022.

She continues to be deeply involved in all aspects of Cheekbone Beauty operations, including its ongoing commitment to people and the planet.

Cheekbone Beauty is available in 52 Sephora stores across Canada as a Sephora Clean and Planet Positive brand, and in 609 JCPenney stores across the U.S.

Giving back to the Indigenous community is critical to Cheekbone Beauty's mission. The company has contributed \$200,000 in product and monetary donations to organizations across North America, with no plans of slowing.



Kyle Dubas (BSM '07)
President of Hockey Operations,
Pittsburgh Penguins

Honorary Doctorate Recipient

Kyle Dubas (BSM '07) is in his first season as the President of Hockey Operations for the Pittsburgh Penguins after being named to the position on June 1, 2023. In his role, Dubas, 37, oversees all aspects of the Penguins' hockey operations department, including establishing the strategic vision and philosophy for the franchise.

Prior to joining the Penguins, Dubas spent the previous nine seasons as a member of the Toronto Maple Leafs organization, including the last five as general manager. At the time of his hiring in 2018, he became the second-youngest general manager in NHL history at age 32.

During Dubas' five seasons as general manager of the Maple Leafs, the team compiled a regular-season record of 221-109-42 with a .651 points percentage, ranking fifth in the league in wins and points percentage. Three of the five best regular seasons in Maple Leafs history by wins and points percentage came under his tenure (2018-19, '21-22 and '22-23).

The organization qualified for the Stanley Cup playoffs each year during his tenure, and in 2022-23, Dubas guided the Maple Leafs to their first playoff series victory since the 2003-04 campaign.

The Sault Ste. Marie, Ont., native and Brock University Sport Management graduate originally joined the Maple Leafs organization as an assistant general manager in 2014.

Prior to joining Toronto, Dubas served as general manager of his hometown Sault Ste. Marie Greyhounds of the Ontario Hockey League for three seasons from 2011-14.

Dubas and his wife, Shannon, have two children, Leo and Lennon.



Mike Griffin

Faculty Award for Excellence in Teaching

Mike Griffin has worked across the country as a theatre educator, director and playwright. He has taught at Brock University in the Department of Dramatic Arts for the past eight years. His subject areas include acting, directing, devising, movement, mask and Commedia dell'Arte. Griffin also regularly directs theatrical productions within DART's Mainstage season. His most recent production was *Red Bike* written by Caridad Svich.

Griffin holds a BFA in Acting and a BEd in teaching Drama and English at the secondary school level from the University of British Columbia. As well, he has a Master of Fine Arts in Directing from the University of Calgary and further international training in Commedia, mask, physical theatre and voice/movement. He has also worked with many theatre companies as a professional artist, including Bard on the Beach, Theatre Calgary, Vertigo Mystery Theatre and Ground Zero Theatre.

Griffin pedagogy explores student-centered learning, relationship building, ensemble methodology and student agency within grading processes. Additionally, his research examines classical Commedia dell'Arte and its relationship to contemporary contexts, with special interest in Commedia's subversive nature. Griffin is published in *The Routledge Companion to Commedia dell'Arte*, with a chapter on the rival playwrights Carlo Goldoni and Carlo Gozzi, and has written and/or adapted four Commedia plays, including his most recent *Pantalone's Palace*. Griffin is now working on *The Mysterious Mind of Molly McGillicuddy*, a full-mask and physical theatre play that explores mind traumatic brain injury and related mental health.



Barak Shoshany

Assistant Professor,
Department of Physics

Faculty Award for Excellence in Teaching

Barak Shoshany has taught six different undergraduate courses, most of them multiple times, and mentored seven students in research projects. He recently created a new second-year course in Astronomy by brainstorming potential topics of interest with students and then teaching them how to find and utilize suitable resources.

Shoshany has supervised students in various research projects, including fourth-year Honours thesis projects (PHYS 4F90 and 4F91) and internships funded by internal and external grants and awards. In these projects, he worked very closely with students, meeting with them on a weekly basis, helping them understand the relevant material and developing their research and problem-solving skills. Most of these projects culminated in publishable results, with two already published and three other publications in preparation. The students who have already graduated have all been accepted to prestigious graduate schools in physics, math and astronomy.

Shoshany's first-year Astronomy courses ASTR 1P01 and ASTR 1P02 service the entire Brock community. They are taken by approximately 5,000 students from all majors every year, more than any other course in the Faculty of Mathematics and Science.
