History of Brock University

Opened in 1964, Brock University is named for Major-General Sir Isaac Brock, who died in battle at nearby Queenston Heights in the War of 1812. Brock's final words were said to have been "Push on, my brave fellows!" A Latin translation of this is "Surgite!" — which is Brock University's motto.

The seeds of the University were sown long before the doors first opened. Brock's story is about a community that rose up and built the institution it wanted for its future.

In the late 1950s, there was growing public discussion about how Niagara should have its own university. The grassroots sentiment became a movement in 1957 when the Allanburg Women's Institute asked the Ontario government to consider opening a university in the region.

By fall 1962, the Brock Founders Committee was incorporated. They received approval to create a new university, then developed an administrative and academic plan. Then they began raising money.

After years of meetings and fundraising, Brock opened in September 1964. It had 127 students in a refurbished refrigeration factory at the foot of the Niagara Escarpment in St. Catharines. In 1966, the landmark Brock Tower was completed, and Faculties began moving "up the hill" to the University's permanent home atop the Niagara Escarpment.

For the next 30 years, Brock sent thousands of graduates on to successful careers. It built a name for its personal quality of teaching afforded by attentive faculty and controlled class sizes. As the new millennium dawned, enrolment soared. Brock transformed from an undergraduate institute to a comprehensive University with flourishing research, graduate and doctoral programs.

The campus steadily expanded to keep pace with the demand for a Brock education with the construction of world-class research labs, a landmark fine arts complex, an international students' centre and a new research and innovation hub.

Brock serves its community as a cultural, academic and recreational centre, bringing excellent facilities to the people who created the University all those years ago. We are committed to building our community and fostering an environment that serves our students and our neighbours.

The modern university is the lineal descendant of the university of the Middle Ages. Its purposes and organization, even much of its ceremonial role, are medieval in origin.

Today's ceremony stems from the medieval tradition. The procession of the guild of teachers, whose solemn assembly, or Convocation, is the modern equivalent of the full congregation of all Faculties, is followed by the Chancellor and the Mace, the symbol of the University's corporate authority. The academic gowns, hoods and caps declare in their various designs and colours the academic qualifications of the faculty. The citations and presentations by the faculty to the Chancellor attest to the Chancellor and to society the degree of proficiency attained by the students of the University.

The Chancellor confers upon the students the appropriate degree. It is the act, not a certificate, which constitutes the validity of the degree bestowed. The statement "I admit you" and the placing of the students' hands within those of the Chancellor and his associates, bind the students to the University. They receive what the University has been and what it is today. The graduates are what the University hopes to be.




The University flag

Our flag is the Banner of Arms of the Grant of Arms to Brock University, granted on March 17, 1965. The main feature on the flag is a gold-winged eagle with the book of learning on its breast. Yellow and red are colours associated with academic institutions and the eagle was once thought to be the bird that flew the highest and was the wisest.

The top the flag includes the maple leaf, representing Canada; a trillium representing Ontario and a shell (escallop)-a symbol long associated with the Lincoln-Welland Regiment and the County of Welland. The flag, donated by the members of Brock's 1994 Quarter Century Club, stands on the stage for each Convocation ceremony and is flown daily on campus.

Eagle Staff

The Eagle Staff is sacred and clears the way for everything that comes after it. An Eagle staff is used by Indigenous nations to represent their people and honour the veterans or warriors of the past and present.

This Eagle Staff was created for the Hadiya'dagénhahs First Nations, Métis and Inuit Student Centre at Brock University by Nipissing First Nation Elder Abiidaasmosede and includes four beaded medallions by Cayuga and Tuscarora beadwork artist Mary Annette Printup-Clause.

Hadiya'dagénhahs Peer Assistant Gitchi Nanakwad, an Anishinaabe Ojibwe is the Eagle Staff Carrier.

During the ceremony, the staff faces east to represent new beginnings.

Beta Gamma Sigma

Beta Gamma Sigma is the honour society serving business programs accredited by AACSB International — the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business.

Membership in Beta Gamma Sigma is the highest recognition a business student anywhere in the world can receive in a business program accredited by AACSB International. Brock received accreditation to AACSB in 2003, joining top international business schools, and in 2004 was admitted into Beta Gamma Sigma.

Membership in this honours society is offered only to the best business and accounting students: undergraduates completing third year in the top 10 per cent of their class and graduates ranking in the top 10 per cent of their undergraduate programs or top 20 per cent of their master's program.

Campus Wide Co-Curriculum

The Campus-Wide Co-Curriculum is a program designed to enhance the Brock student experience through the completion of activities and opportunities within 10 different co- curricular domains.

By completing the Campus-Wide Co-Curriculum, a student has made a meaningful investment in their holistic development and has demonstrated a significant commitment to continuous learning and personal growth. Students who complete the program are eligible to be inducted into the Isaac Brock Insignia Circle, a distinguished society of current students and alumni who are highly engaged in the Brock experience. This distinction is acknowledged by a red cord worn by the graduand.

Ambearrister

An 'Ambearrister' was gifted to Brock University in 2020 by Dr. Cindy Blackstock, Director of First Nations Child and Family Caring Society (FNCFC). This bear, an extension of the 'Reconciliation Ambearrister' program, is an initiative and resource created by the Caring Society to address inequalities of Indigenous children, youth and families. Today, this program extends itself to uplift reconciliation efforts from all peoples, recognizing that if reconciliation is to take place it must reside within each and everyone. The program also acknowledges that reconciliation and "addressing discrimination takes love, honesty, compassion and a real commitment to helping others do the right thing" (FNCFC). Under the guidance of an Elder, Brock's 'Ambearrister' received their name: Entiohahathé'te (It will be a bright road/path). Entiohahathé'te is meant to help us move forward and do work that supports these words. More importantly, they encourage thought on how we can act on these words and make ideas and concepts surrounding reconciliation a reality at Brock University. Entiohahathé'te will also be a gentle reminder for the University to commit to the Calls for Action offered by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.

Entiohahathé'te's has found a home in The Phyllis Webstad Library located in Hadiya'dagénhahs First Nations, Métis and Inuit Student Centre.



Academic regalia

Academic regalia at Convocation is steeped in tradition. All participants wear gowns, which are reminiscent of the robes worn by monks or clergy in medieval times. Hoods, worn draped over the shoulders and back, are derivatives of the simple coverings worn by people of all classes to keep their heads warm in an inhospitable climate.

The Chancellor's gown is made from aegean blue silk and trimmed with gold lace. It is worn with a round velvet cap with a gold tassel. The Vice-Chancellor's gown is similar, but trimmed with silver. The University coat-of-arms is embroidered on the front facing of each gown. Honorary doctors wear gowns made of blue material with gold facings down the front and on each sleeve.

Faculty members wear the academic regalia appropriate to their degrees. Most doctoral gowns are more than one colour and many have three horizontal bars of velvet on each sleeve. Hoods signify the degrees and institutions from which they were received. Since Brock has faculty who graduated from scores of different universities, the Convocation procession is dramatic and colourful.

Brock's graduates wear aegean blue gowns and, after being admitted to their degrees, don distinctive hoods which identify them as graduates of our University. Made of scarlet viyella, the hoods are lined with navy blue and gold material. Three bars of navy blue are set against the gold in a manner that suggests a dress uniform that might have been worn by General Brock.



The edge of each hood is trimmed with velvet in the appropriate colour for the degree:

Honour cords

Honour cords are worn by graduands meeting the following criteria:

Graduands who have completed a 20-credit honours program with first-class honours standing, which requires a minimum 80 per cent average in all major credits and a minimum of 70 per cent in the remaining credits. As well, a transfer student must have completed a minimum of five credits at Brock University, including all departmental honours requirements for Year 4 and have maintained a minimum 75 per cent overall average and a minimum 80 per cent major average (based on Brock courses only).

or:

Graduands who have completed the approved 15-credit pass degree or 20-credit non-honours degree with a minimum 80 per cent overall average. Transfer students require a minimum 80 per cent cumulative average in all Brock courses and a minimum 80 per cent overall average.

Awards in excellence




Maude Barlow
Canadian activist
and author

Honorary Doctorate Recipient

A respected Canadian activist and author, Maude Barlow chairs the board of Washington-based Food and Water Watch and is the founder of the Blue Planet Project. She co-founded the Council of Canadians, serves on the Board of Advisors of the Global Alliance for the Rights of Nature, is a former Councillor with the Hamburg-based World Future Council and serves as Chancellor of Brescia University College in London, Ont.

Barlow has amassed many honours throughout her career, including the Right Livelihood Award (known as the "Alternative Nobel Prize"), the Lannan Foundation Cultural Freedom Fellowship Award, the Canadian Environment Awards' Citation of Lifetime Achievement, the Earth Day Canada Outstanding Environmental Achievement Award, the Planet in Focus Eco Hero Award and the EarthCare Award — the highest international honour of the Sierra Club (U.S.).

In 2008-09, she served as Senior Advisor on Water to the 63rd President of the United Nations General Assembly and was a leader in the campaign to have water recognized as a human right by the U.N. She is the creator of the Blue Communities project in which municipalities pledge to protect water as a human right and a public trust and ban plastic bottled water. There are now more than 25 million people living in official Blue Community towns and cities around the world.



Fergie Jenkins
Former Major League Baseball
(MLB) player and coach

Honorary Doctorate Recipient

Fergie Jenkins is a towering figure in baseball history and has built a legacy in Canadian sport.

His illustrious career spans 18 years in Major League Baseball (MLB), marked by numerous accolades, including induction into the National Baseball Hall of Fame (1991) and the Texas Rangers Hall of Fame (2004).

Jenkins, a three-time All-Star, boasts achievements such as winning the National League Cy Young Award (1971) and leading in MLB wins twice. He played for the Rangers, Philadelphia Phillies, Chicago Cubs and Boston Red Sox.

Jenkins posted a record of 24-13 including 263 strikeouts across 325 innings and a 2.77 earned run average.

Born in Chatham, Ont., Jenkins has made his mark in history, being the first Canadian inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame. He was also honoured with Canadian postage stamps featuring his image and awards such as the Lou Marsh Trophy and Ontario Sports Hall of Fame induction.

Off the field, Jenkins is a humanitarian, founding the Fergie Jenkins Foundation, which supports various charities. A versatile athlete, he showcased his talents with the Harlem Globetrotters and hockey.



Program Lead, Come to Work Program at CNIB

Honorary Doctorate Recipient

As Program Lead for the Come to Work Program at the Canadian National Institute for the Blind (CNIB) in Victoria, B.C., Tricia Pokorny (BA '95) assists participants with sight loss in developing work readiness skills.

She spent 10 years as the Senior Manager of Accessibility for the Ontario Lottery & Gaming Corporation (OLG), where she managed the Crown corporation's compliance with legislative and administrative requirements of the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act across the province.

As a pioneer in accessibility, Pokorny led the development, implementation and management of an award-winning accessibility and diversity program at Casino Niagara/Fallsview Casino Resort in Niagara Falls for 13 years.

Pokorny's passion for equality and accessibility extends to her volunteering. In addition to fundraising for United Way Niagara and CNIB, she has volunteered with Autism Niagara, Brain Injury Community Re-entry, Brock Student Advisory Committee, Ontario March of Dimes, St. John's Therapy Dogs, Niagara Employment Alliance, Capital Regional District and B.C. Transit Commission in Victoria. She also sits on the Board of Directors for Guide Dogs for the Blind Incorporated and is a member of the government accessibility committee in Ontario and B.C.

Her commitment to accessibility has earned her numerous awards and accolades, including an audience with former Prime Minister Jean Chrétien and the International Labour Organization of the United Nations.



Ali Emami
Assistant Professor,
Computer Science

Faculty Award for Excellence in Teaching

Ali Emami is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Computer Science at Brock University. With a background in Physics and Computer Science, he obtained his BSc, MSc and PhD from McGill University and the Montreal Institute of Learning Algorithms. His research focuses on developing and assessing innovative systems in machine learning, with a specific emphasis on advancing natural language understanding and reasoning. His work has been applied across various real-world domains, including transportation, health care, robotics, gaming and conversational agents. As a recipient of the prestigious five-year NSERC 2022 Discovery Grant, Emami continues to expand his research program, exploring deep learning, neural network architectures and advanced natural language understanding techniques. His current focus lies in addressing the generalizability, interpretability and ethical implications of large language models, contributing to the responsible development of artificial intelligence technologies for the future.



Faculty Award for Excellence in Teaching

Rachel Rensink-Hoff is Associate Professor of Music at the Brock University Marilyn I. Walker School of Fine and Performing Arts and Artistic Director of the Avanti Chamber Singers. She is also the founder of the Niagara Choral Connections workshop series. Prior to her appointment at Brock, she spent eight years on faculty at McMaster University.

Rensink-Hoff is Past Vice-President of Programming for Choral Canada and Past-President of Choirs Ontario and maintains an active career as adjudicator, clinician, workshop presenter and juror both locally and across Canada. She has served as guest conductor of the Nova Scotia Youth Choir (2017), the Alberta Youth Choir (2022) and the Ontario Youth Choir (2023).

The 2014 winner of the Leslie Bell Prize for Choral Conducting of the Ontario Arts Council, Rensink-Hoff and choirs under her direction have received numerous honours and awards. Her university women's choir earned first prize in their category of the 2015 National Choral Competition for Amateur Choirs and in 2019 the Avanti Chamber Singers was named Most Promising New Adult Ensemble. In 2022, she received the Arts in Education Award by the City of St. Catharines. She is honoured to be receiving this year's Faculty of Humanities Award for Excellence in Teaching.


