

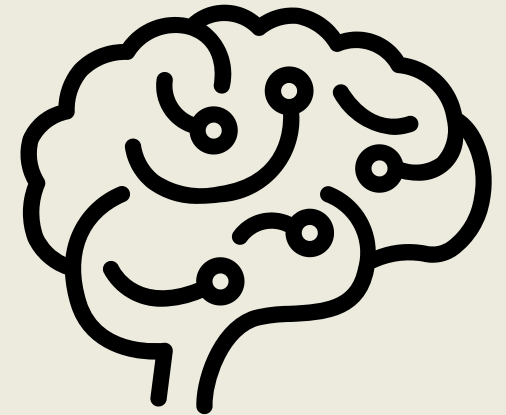

WHAT IS DIALOGIC READING

DIALOGIC READING IS AN
INTERACTIVE WAY OF READING
WHERE ADULTS ASK
QUESTIONS, ENCOURAGE
CHILDRENS RESPONSES, AND
EXTEND CONVERSTIONS TO
SUPPORT LANGUAGE
DEVELOPMENT.

KEY STRATEGIES

Ask: “What do you think will happen next?”

Encourage: “Can you tell me what’s happening?”

Expand: “Yes! The dog is running fast!”

For Educators:

- Model dialogic reading
- Use during group reading
- Share strategies with families

For Families:

- Read daily
- Ask questions while reading
- Let your child lead the conversation
