

MASTERS PREPARATION CERTIFICATE IN EDUCATION (MPCE)

The Masters Preparation Certificate in Education (MPCE) is a post-undergraduate certificate that prepares students for the rigors of graduate study in the broad field of Education and related disciplines.

MPCE courses include a seminar to help navigate the graduate school application process, English test-taking workshops and classes in educational foundations and organizations, Canadian cultural practices, critical thinking, pedagogy and research. These courses are designed and intended to improve English language proficiency, increase familiarity with Canadian practices and engage the student in the local community. The international student will be well-prepared to apply to — and succeed in — a graduate program in a Canadian university. Awards are available for both incoming students from emerging markets and graduating students who excelled in the program.

This one-year (two-term) academic program qualifies the international student to work while studying, as well as to apply for the Post-Graduate Work Program with Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC).

Admissions Criteria

MPCE Conditional Track

Provides conditional admission to the MEd ISP program (with an 80% average in MPCE, 7.0 on the IELTS and no bands below 6.0). The MEd ISP Foundations term will be waived.

- IELTS: 6.5 (no bands below 6.0)
- Deadline: January 15 for earliest consideration

- Application Fee: \$140

MPCE Exploratory Track

Provides the opportunity to strengthen your application to graduate school, improve English proficiency, and demonstrate your ability to do well in the Canadian educational system — and explore opportunities in Canada at the same time.

- IELTS: 6.0 (no bands below 5.5)
- Deadline: Rolling Admissions
- How to Apply: brocku.ca/education/programs/certificate-programs/mpce/
- Application Fee: \$100

Application requirements

1. Digital copy of official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions showing completion of four-year bachelor's degree with the equivalent to 75% grade point average on the Canadian scale.
2. Digital copy of official degree certificate (you may apply if you are currently in your last year of your undergraduate degree)
3. Two reference letters (for Conditional Track)
4. Statement of Interest
5. Resumé
6. English Proficiency Test results. See the website page below for additional types of English Proficiency Test scores that this program will accept.
7. All applications are considered for the Emerging Entrance Award. Additional forms are not required.



Program outline - Start: September for two terms (one academic year)

MPCE classes prepare students for graduate school as well as provide cultural adaptation and academic support.

Notes

Don't have a 4-year degree? Because MPCE is an academic program, it may be considered as a fourth-year equivalent for those with three-year degrees.

Don't have a 75% GPA on the Canadian scale? Every year the MPCE program will accept a small quota of students with a lower average and provide them with the opportunity to demonstrate that they can do well in the Canadian academic system.

Estimated program expenses

- Tuition and textbooks (2020-2021) – \$16,151 CAD
- University fees and health insurance – \$1,600 CAD
- Housing, food and transportation – \$11,000 CAD
