

Submit an abstract to be presented at the 2023 EHQI Conference!

The Exploring Healthcare Quality Improvement Conference will take place on March 25th, 2022, from 13:00–17:00. Attendees will have the opportunity to present their own quality improvement or healthcare-related abstracts during a storyboard presentation session. Please note that storyboard presentations will be selected based on abstract submissions. Abstracts are to be submitted on the EHQI conference website by March 13th, 2023, at 17:00 EST and you will receive a confirmation of acceptance by March 15th, 2023. Please be sure to register for the conference before submitting an abstract.

After your abstract has been accepted by the conference team, we ask that you send us your poster by **March 18th, 2022, at 17:00 EST** (max allowed size of 45 inches x 45 inches). You will be responsible for printing out your poster and bringing it to the conference.

Guidelines for Abstract Submission

- **Storyboard Title**
 - A descriptive title for your project, abstract, and/or storyboard.
 - **Authors**
- Place an asterisk beside the presenting author(s). Record author affiliations (for example: Madelyn P. Law, Brock University).
 - Background
- What is the problem of interest? Provide a brief description of the background/issue your project is addressing.
- 4 Aim
 Describe your aim statement.
 - Improvement Initiatives
- Briefly describe all actions taken, change concepts or interventions, implementation, and measures of effectiveness.
 - Results & Impact
- Summarize key outcomes and/or lessons learned (preliminary data will be accepted) and the impact (or expected impact) these will have on health outcomes or health system performance.
- How does your project link to the focus of the conference or improving healthcare?

Write a brief statement describing the relevance of your work to healthcare and/or quality improvement.
