Elevating Devices Incident Reporting Form as required by O.Reg 209/01

INSTRUCTIONS TO THE ELEVATING DEVICES INCIDENT REPORTING FORM

The following instructions are provided for information only.

For complete instructions, refer to the *Technical Standards & Safety Act, 2000 and Ontario Regulation 209/01 Elevating Devices* and the Directors Guideline ED-230/09 available at http://www.tssa.org/regulated/elevating/elevating/safety.asp?loc3=adob

- a) Is reporting of incidents mandatory? Yes, required by the Technical Standards & Safety Act, 2000 and section 36 of the Ontario Regulations 209/01. Section 37(1) of the Act specifies fines for failure to report an incident.
- b) Is the use of this form mandatory? Yes.
- Are owners and contractors required to report?
 Yes. See table below.

d) What is voluntary reporting of an instance of elevated exposure to risk?

If a device is in condition that does NOT constitute an immediate hazard, but the condition poses an "<u>elevated exposure to risk</u>" to the public, voluntary reporting provides additional data that can aid in better risk informed decision making by the Director, the elevating devices safety program and TSSA's industry councils.
