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PRACTICAL INFORMATION	
Orientation Activities	<p>Orientation for students arriving in the Fall semester will take place the first week of September (exact dates to be confirmed).</p> <p>Many different social and informational events will be planned by the Office of International Services, as well as the Goodman School of Business. Events will be posted online by late summer and students will receive information via e-mail.</p> <p>Second semester orientation will be held during the first week of January (exact date to be confirmed). Details will be emailed to incoming students in December.</p>
On Campus Accommodation	<p>On campus residence is usually available for all exchange students who apply early enough. Exchange students generally prefer to live in Quarry View residence where cooking facilities are available.</p> <p>Note: Residence fees posted on the web site are for a full year - fees for students staying for one semester will be half of the amount posted. Estimated costs: \$850-1250 per month plus a mandatory meal plan.</p>
Off Campus Accommodation	<p>Off-campus housing is available and the Off-Campus Living Office can assist students in finding a suitable place to stay. It is less expensive than on-campus residence but more difficult to find landlords willing to rent to students for 4 months. Estimated rent costs: \$500-800CDN/month. Some Brock students sublet their apartments to exchange students for one semester. Contact business.exchange@brocku.ca for more information.</p>

Facilities and Location	<p>The Brock campus offers a fully equipped fitness centre and indoor running track, Olympic-sized swimming pool, excellent library facilities, computer labs and much more. There are clubs for international students that organize social events as well as many other student-run activities.</p> <p>The Niagara region is one of the major tourist areas in Canada and is a short drive from the Canada-US border. St. Catharines is 15 minutes from Niagara Falls, and about an hour from downtown Toronto. There are many sights to see and things to do.</p>
Health Insurance	<p>Enrolment in University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP) is MANDATORY for all international students studying at Brock University. Students will sign up for this during the mandatory orientation session.</p>
