MARS/HIST 3F51 VIKING AND MEDIEVAL ISLE OF MAN MAY 2024

In May 2024, 22 Medieval and Renaissance Studies and History students embarked on a voyage of discovery to the Isle of Man, a small island in the middle of the Irish Sea with a rich history and heritage. Following a brief classroom session at Brock, we journeyed to the Island to experience history in its environment.

From the Sound in the south to Andreas in the north, from Peel in the west to our base in Douglas in the east, and from seashore to mountain, we covered the entire island in an amazing nine-day visit. We took in medieval castles, cathedrals, and abbeys; historic Tynwald Hill; early Christian and Viking age settlement sites, burials, and a chance to get up close and personal with unique early sculptures from 5 parish churches. Along the way, we also learned about the growth of Douglas and Castletown, the Island's unique constitutional position, the story of internment in World War II, Victorian tourism, railways, and waterwheels, native animal species - and we even experienced the beginning of the annual TT motorcycle races.
