Eduroam Wireless Setup (Macintosh)

The following instructions are for setting up eduroam on a Macintosh computer. Before you continue, you will need to know what version of Mac OS you are running. To find the version you are running, follow the instructions below.

- Click on the Apple symbol in the top left corner of your screen
- Click on About This Mac
- A dialog box will appear, under the title Mac OS X there will be a version number. If the version is 10.5.x then you are running Leopard.
