



All about Brock 2009-10

Located at the centre of Canada's beautiful Niagara Peninsula, Brock University provides a distinctive, dynamic and creative learning experience. We encourage students, faculty and staff to develop both sides of their brain — personally and academically — and become well-rounded individuals as unique as fingerprints.

Our motivated scholars are bold and independent. They've chosen Brock's dynamic culture because it breaks the boundaries of academic convention.

In 2009, we launched the Campaign for a Bold New Brock, a massive \$75-million fundraising campaign to build much-needed space, bolster our research capacity and help create new industries for Ontario.

The campaign will also fund new teaching and research buildings and pump millions of dollars into new bursaries, scholarships and student awards.

Consider the following facts about Brock:

- We're Niagara's fifth-largest employer, directly employing 1,200 academic and support staff jobs. Brock's more than 17,000 students are an important source of revenue for the region, contributing approximately \$366 million annually to the area's economy.
- 6.5 per cent of our students are from outside Canada, representing more than 80 countries: 5.0 per cent of undergraduate students and 22 per cent of graduate students.
- 75 undergraduate programs, 34 master's programs, six doctoral programs and more in development.

- Eight Brock faculty members have received the 3M Teaching Fellowship Award, the only national award that recognizes teaching excellence and educational leadership. Since 1986, only 238 recipients have been awarded the 3M Teaching Fellowship Award from Canada's more than 40,000 professors.
- We were Ontario's only university with two out of the 10 finalists in TVO's Big Ideas Best Lecturer 2008 Competition.
- We have 10 Canada Research Chairs.
- Brock Co-op is Canada's fifth-largest program, and the third largest in the province, with more than 2,000 students annually participating. The program currently achieves an impressive 93 per cent work-term placement.
- About 67,000 alumni practise their skills around the world.
- Brock is Canada's only university in a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve.
- Employment rate of Brock graduates two years after graduation is in the mid-90 per cent range.
- Students gave Brock a grade of A- in the quality of education in the *Globe and Mail's 2009 University Report Card*.

Opened in 1964, Brock was named for Maj.-Gen. Sir Isaac Brock, who lost his life at Queenston Heights in the War of 1812.

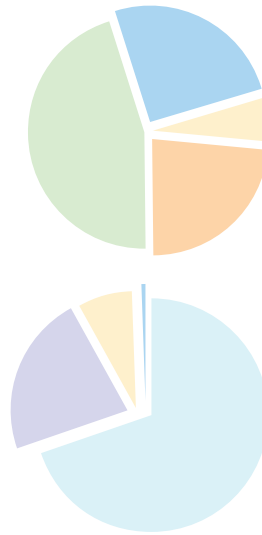
