Located at the centre of Canada's beautiful Niagara Peninsula, Brock University provides a distinctive, dynamic and creative learning experience. We encourage students, faculty and staff to develop both sides of their brain — personally and academically — and become well-rounded individuals as unique as fingerprints.

Our motivated scholars are bold and independent. They've chosen Brock's dynamic culture because it breaks the boundaries of academic convention.

In 2009, we launched the Campaign for a Bold New Brock, a \$75-million fundraising campaign to build much-needed space, bolster our research capacity and help create new industries for Ontario.

The campaign will also fund new teaching and research buildings and pump millions of dollars into new bursaries, scholarships and student awards.

Consider the following facts about Brock:

- We're one of Niagara's largest employers, directly employing about 1,500 permanent academic and support staff.
- 7.8 per cent of our students are from outside Canada, representing 90 countries: 5.8 per cent of undergraduate students and 29.9 per cent of graduate students.

- Nine Brock faculty members have received the 3M Teaching Fellowship Award, the only national award that recognizes teaching excellence and educational leadership.
- We have 12 Canada Research Chairs.
- Brock Co-op is Canada's fifth-largest program, and the third largest in the province, with more than 2,000 students annually participating. The program currently achieves an impressive 98 per cent work-term placement.
- More than 74,000 alumni practise their skills around the world.
- Brock was Canada's first university to be named part of a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve.
- Employment rate of Brock graduates two years after graduation is in the mid-90 per cent range.

Opened in 1964, Brock was named for Maj.-Gen. Sir Isaac Brock, who lost his life at Queenston Heights in the War of 1812.

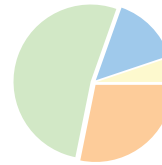

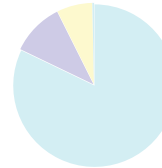
Rank Distribution
