



## ALL ABOUT BROCK 2015-16

Brock University is a comprehensive institution with rich academic programs and prominent research activity. Located in Ontario's scenic Niagara region, Brock is one of a handful of universities in the world to be situated in a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve.

With 18,500 students, Brock is small enough to be intimate but big enough to be world-class and in-demand. It's no wonder more than 1,800 of these students come from 88 countries to study here.

Over the past decade, more than \$221 million has been invested into state-of-the-art research and teaching facilities and student-centred spaces.

Students pursue academic programs with some of the best scholars and professionals in their fields, with opportunities for small-group learning and hands-on research experience.

Brock's transdisciplinary, community-based research and collaborations support emerging industry clusters such as digital media, biomanufacturing, health and well-being and green technology.

Our 70 undergraduate and 46 graduate diploma, master's and doctoral programs take students beyond the classroom. With one of the most diversified co-op programs in Canada and a wide range of co-curricular, volunteer and experiential learning opportunities, students discover their passions, learn valuable skills and graduate prepared to be leaders in their community and in their careers.

Marquee programs include lifespan development, oenology and viticulture, nursing and co-op accounting. Sport management has been ranked as one of the best in the world.

Brock's flexible options for learning include condensed, online and on-campus courses.

Globally, Brock offers students academic and experiential opportunities on six continents.

### Consider the following facts about Brock:

- We're one of Niagara's largest employers, with more than 5,700 ongoing and temporary faculty and staff.
- Ten per cent of our students come from outside Canada, representing 88 countries.
- Nine Brock faculty members have received the 3M Teaching Fellowship Award. Over more than three decades, Brock is top five among all Ontario universities for 3M Teaching Fellowship Award winners. Considered Canada's most prestigious prize for teaching excellence at the university level, only 10 are given out nation-wide each year.
- We have eight Canada Research Chairs.
- More than \$17.8 million in scholarships, fellowships, bursaries and student awards were made available to current students in 2015-16.
- Brock offers co-op education opportunities in 39 programs, enabling full-time, undergraduate students to graduate with a minimum of 12 months of relevant work experience.
- Brock has 89,907 alumni in Canada and around the world.
- The employment rate of Brock graduates two years after graduation is 94 per cent, which is above the Ontario average.

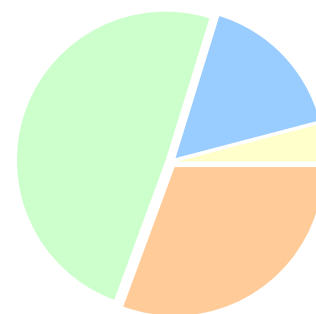

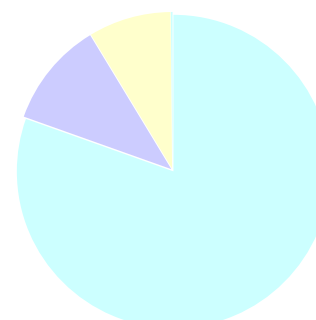
