Is it:

- Your [own material](#)?
- Material that is [out of copyright](#)?
- An [insubstantial portion](#) of a work?
- Material produced by the [Canadian, Ontario or U.S. governments](#)?

Is it:

- An article from an e-journal or an excerpt from an e-book licensed by the Library?

Your easiest option is to link to the material, but uploading the material directly is possible in some cases.

For journal articles - check the journal's terms of use by using the [Library's licence database](#). You will either be able to post the PDF directly or link to the article.

For e-book excerpts, contact liblicense@brocku.ca

Is it:

- Material on a publicly accessible website?

Yes →

Linking is the simplest option, but if you want to upload the material directly, you can do so if:

- The use is [fair dealing under Brock's Fair Dealing Policy](#), OR if:
- The material appears to have been posted by or with the consent of the © owner, there is no clearly visible notice prohibiting what you want to do, there is no 'digital lock' preventing you from accessing or copying the material, and you credit the author and source of the materials.

Is it:

- A scanned book chapter, article from a journal not licensed by the Library or other published material?

Yes →

You can upload scanned material to Isaak/Sakai if:

- The use is [fair dealing under Brock's Fair Dealing Policy](#), OR if:
- Your use is covered by the [Access Copyright licence](#) – you'll need to confirm the work is within Access' repertoire using its [online look-up tool](#), copying must be limited to one article, one book chapter (provided it is no more than 20%), or up to 20% of a work, and copies must be made from a lawfully obtained copy.
