DART 3P91 Shakespeare in Performance

Shakespeare: period performance conditions and stage history, based on close analysis of selected texts.

DART 4P51 Shakespeare: Voice and Text

Embodied study of Shakespeare's verse and prose using practical tools to decipher, experience and communicate Shakespeare's language.

Format: Lab, 36 hours.

DART 3P40 Self-Producing

Exploration of various modes of response to theatrical performances, including written reviews, practice-based critiques, and creative offerings. Skills and strategies for producing independent theatre in festival and non-festival formats. Choosing a project, forming a team, creating budgets, scheduling, meetings, effective marketing strategies, and community building.

Short description: A self-producing intensive focused on developing plans for independently producing theatre in both festival and non-festival formats.

Long description: Participants will learn the ins and outs of self-producing in both festival and non-festival formats. Students will learn how to pick the right project, how to form a team and engage other artists, create budgets, schedule rehearsals and production meetings, implement effective marketing strategies and plan complimentary community building activities in tandem with their productions. The first week will focus on self-producing in a festival or Fringe format, with little to no budget. Participants will learn ways to effectively fundraise, garner in-kind support and hustle to realize successful projects infestival. The second week will focus on self-producing out of festival with a budget. Learning will focus on grant writing, securing presenting and community partners, as well as planning and executing ancillary events.

Why students should take this course: A great shift has occurred over the past twenty-five years in Canadian Theatre, where many theatre artists and arts professionals have started building their careers and making a living through self-producing means. As theatre professionals work to create a more equitable industry, self-production provides a path to do so outside tired colonial models. In a DART context, where students have already been exposed to a myriad of theatrical disciplines, the self-producing model is an excellent one for further hands-on learning. A self-producing intensive will provide a bridge for students to apply the praxis knowledge they have gained at Brock to early career building, enabling them to become successful theatre professionals.

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DART 4P94 Creative and Critical Responses to Theatre

Exploration of various modes of response to theatrical performances, including written reviews, practice-based critiques, and creative offerings.

Long Description: This Brock University course invites students to explore various modes of response to theatrical performances, including written reviews, practice-based critiques, and creative offerings. The journey of the course is towards the discovery and nurturing of your personal voice in response to productions that you encounter.

Course activities include seeing productions and creating creative/critical responses to them; engaging with online course materials about equitable approaches to theatre criticism; reading and discussing relevant academic and journalistic articles; and learning about alternative, digital, performative, and visual forms of critical response to performance.

The instruction of this summertime intensive will be online and will combine synchronous and asynchronous learning. Course session days (weekdays between July 8 – August 2) will begin with the students and instructor convening over video conference between 1-2 pm, with students otherwise working asynchronously (if students with jobs are able to take a break between 1-2 pm for the synchronous meeting, and are able to complete assignments in a timely manner, the course will be manageable for them).

Live field trips will be organized to the Shaw, Stratford, and/or Toronto Fringe Festivals; responding to productions at these festivals will be part of the course work. There will be course fees associated with these theatre viewing trips but purchase of books or other course materials is not required (all materials will be made available online).

Format: Seminar, 36 hours; additional field trips as required.
