**Timothy White** performs throughout southern Ontario as a soloist, freelance trumpeter, and clinician, Tim has played in the Hamilton Philharmonic Orchestra, Symphony Nova Scotia, the Niagara Symphony, and is currently principal trumpet with Sinfonia Ancaster. His quintet, the Rondeau Brass ( <https://rondeaubrass.com>), has performed at McMaster University, Brock University and numerous churches throughout southern Ontario. Tim can be heard on Joseph Boudreau's studio album, Yesterday's Today.

A native of Hamilton, Ontario, Tim earned a Master of Music degree from the University of Michigan where he studied trumpet with Ramon Parcells of the Detroit Symphony and Armando Ghitalla of the Boston Symphony.

**Mike Polci** is member of the trombone section of Orchestra London Canada and he works regularly with the Orchestras of Hamilton , Kitchener and Windsor. He studied trombone with Joseph Castello at the University of Western Ontario. He has also performed with the Canadian Opera Company and the National Ballet of Canada. Mike has performed in many theatrical productions and Broadway shows over the years including many performances with the Stratford and Shaw Festivals. He has a great love for all kinds of jazz music and is the leader of the Dixie Dawgs jazz combo. Over the years Mike has been thrilled and fortunate enough to have worked with great entertainers such Diana Krall, Ray Charles, The Temptations, The Supremes and the Four Tops, among others. Mike is currently the instructor of Low Brass at McMaster University and Mohawk College.

**Lesley Kingham** graduated with a Masters in Pipe Organ Performance and Literature from the University of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana in 1996, studying under Dr. Craig Cramer. Throughout the program she served as the liturgical assistant at the Basilica of the Sacred Heart. She received her Bachelor of Music from the University of Western Ontario in 1994, at which time she was awarded the gold medal for pipe organ performance. She was the staff accompanist and keyboard harmony instructor at Brock University for many years and is currently the organ instructor at the university in addition to being the accompanist for the Avanti Chamber Singers. Lesley is the organist and music director at St Thomas' Anglican Church in St Catharines and operates a private teaching studio.
