The Opportunity

Reporting to the Production Manager and/or Technical Director, the Theatre Technical Production Assistant is responsible for providing the technical elements for departmental production and teaching, supporting teaching of technical production by instruction or lab demonstration, supervising and maintaining DART spaces, technical inventory and equipment, and coordinating and supervising students and hired technicians.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Providing technical and artistic support to Departmental theatrical production as coordinated by the Production Manager of the Marylyn I Walker School of Performing Arts (MIWSFPA)
- Providing autonomous technical direction of course oriented outcomes, and providing guidance to, and receiving support from students assigned to these outcomes

- Assisting with the maintenance and deployment of Departmental technical equipment and facilities as directed by the Production Manager of the MIWSFPA, including documenting, purchasing, and replacing equipment and construction materials as required
- Collaborating with course instructors to support their course delivery as it relates to design, stagecraft and wardrobe, ensuring physical facilities meet the specific needs of provided courses
- Working in a professional and collegial manner with the Technical Production team of the Centre for the Arts of Brock University
- Assisting with MIWSFPA "outreach" events for the University and the local community
- Hanging and focusing theatrical lighting equipment
- Programing lighting and audio control software and equipment
- Repairing electrical and electronic equipment
- Supervising Student Technical Assistant

The ideal candidate will have:

- BFA in Technical Theatre, or equivalent combination of education and experience
- Demonstrated knowledge of the educational process and the proven ability to explain and demonstrate techniques to students
- Proven ability to operate digital and analog sound systems, computer sound and video editing, computerized lighting systems, carpentry and rigging
- **Certifications:** First Aid Level II, Entertainment Rigging, Pyrotechnics, Stage Weaponry, WHMIS knowledge and application, Fall Protection Training, Valid Driver's License
- Strong verbal, written and interpersonal skills
- Energetic, flexible and adaptable persona, with the ability to mentor and coach students
- Proven ability to manage multiple projects
- Demonstrated ability to perform heavy lifting, working at heights on ladders and other theatre rigging equipment and lighting grids, and working in confined spaces
- Demonstrated knowledge of safety protocols for theatre production equipment and ability to maintain and enforce these protocols
- Ability to work evenings and weekends
