PRI Policy on Speakers and Panels

All PRI events talks, panels, and round-tables will be live-streamed and recorded (unless agreed upon between the PRI Executive Committee and the speaker). The recording will be added to the YouTube channel.

Stand-alone speakers and/or speaker series

- 1. We will showcase a diversity of speakers. To that end, we will seek speakers from diverse ethnic, linguistic, and cultural backgrounds, diverse bodily abilities, and diverse career stages or types of practice.
- 2. We will prioritize speakers who are engaged with work we find particularly important, interesting, and/or innovative regardless of status, name recognition, affiliation, etc. This entails actively seeking early career researchers (graduate students, postdoctoral fellows, assistant professors, non-academic practitioners) and showcasing the work as well as that of more senior researchers.
- 3. We will provide honoraria for speakers. Additional honoraria will be provided if there is further engagement with PRI members such as meeting with reading/working groups, individual mentoring, etc.

Panels and Roundtable

- 1. The Executive Committee will solicit volunteers to organize, chair, and solicit presenters for panels and round-tables.
 - a. Organizers will be bound by EDIA the principles adhered to by the PRI and by the same principles guiding stand-alone speakers stated above. It is highly desirable that each panel or round-table showcase the work of diverse researchers.
