Morse Code Bracelets

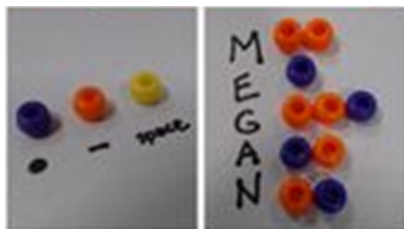
Morse code is a communication method to encode the alphabet as standardized sequences of two different symbols called dots and dashes. Morse code is named after Samuel Morse, the inventor of the telegraph! The telegraph was invented in the 1800's and was used to transmit coded signals over a distance before the telephone and LONG before there was internet.

Materials:

- Beads (3 different colours)
- String
- Scissors
- Paper
- Pencil or pen

Steps:

1. Separate your colours so that one colour is a dot, one is a line and one is a space.
2. Spell out your name using the morse code bank below on a piece of paper to start. (Look at the picture below for an example).
3. Line out your beads on the piece of paper for each letter of your name.
4. Measure your string around your wrist so you know how much you will need.
5. Cut your string the proper amount and tie a knot in one end.
6. Place your letters on the string in order and make sure to use your space.
7. Once done, tie the two ends of your string together and now you have a coded bracelet!
