

REB Guideline: Phlebotomy

- 1. The Health Science Research Ethics Board (HREB) has developed concrete guidelines regarding the qualifications required in order for an individual to perform a blood draw. These guidelines are in place to streamline our procedures and ensure the safety and welfare of all participants.
- 2. The HREB normally expects blood draws to be performed by one of the individuals listed below:
 - a. A technician employed by a laboratory licensed under the Laboratory and Specimen Collection Centre Licensing Act;
 - Licensed Medical Laboratory Technologist (must show proof of successful completion of a medical laboratory technology program offered at an institution accredited by the Canadian Medical Association [CMA] in Canada and certification through Ontario Society of Medical Technologists);
 - c. Registered nurses in accordance with their professional regulations.
- 3. Each application will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
