"Going Out: Leisure, community, scenic travel"

JOAN Nicks gave us an illustrated talk on the public role of movie theatres in early 20th century Niagara Falls, the artful road guides driving post-war travel, and the vernacular design of the iconic road-side motel.

She talked about the deterioration of buildings, still standing, on Bridge Street. She began with an image of the Niagara Falls railway station and the Hotel Europa across the street. The Hotel Europa opened as the Trennick Hotel in 1910 and underwent several name changes.

Joan continued to talk about buildings on Queen Street. The Seneca Theatre hosted the Canadian premiere of Marilyn Monroe's film "Niagara".
