Mr. Louis Guay joined the Canadian Foreign Service in 1973, and was assigned to Mexico, Athens, Greece, Cameroon, Venezuela, DRC (Zaire), Dominican Republic and Gabon where he served as Ambassador to Gabon and concurrently to Equatorial Guinea and Sao Tomé and Principe. On leave from the government, Mr. Guay directed a project for the creation of a network of technical schools in Cameroon and later assumed the responsibilities as Country Manager for a mining company in the Dominican Republic. continuous interest with resources and conflict management issues drew him to take on responsibilities related to Sierra Leone and Sudan and with the United Nations, as the Special Assistant to the UN Secretary General Special Envoy to Niger on the Second Tuareg Rebellion. He was named Coordinator for Corporate Social Responsibility for the Americas in the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade in October 2009. In 2011, after a long and distinguished career with the Foreign Service, Mr. Guay became Senior Fellow at St. Paul University, Ottawa, where he has developed a course on Social Responsibility and Sustainable Development.
