5-4 Individual mandate upheld as a tax.



Majority opinion by Chief Justice Roberts
"The Affordable Care Act's requirement that certain individuals pay a financial penalty for not obtaining health insurance may reasonably be characterized as a tax. Because the Constitution permits such a tax, it is not our role to forbid it, or to pass upon its wisdom or fairness."



Disseminating joint opinion
"The court regards its strained statutory interpretation as judicial modesty. It is not. It amounts instead to a not judicial overreach that creates a debilitated, inoperable version of health care regulation. Congress did not enact and the public does not want this law."

Congress's Taxing Powers Cited — Medicaid Growth Limited

WASHINGTON — The Supreme Court on Thursday upheld President Obama's health care overhaul law, saying it requires that most Americans obtain insurance or pay a penalty for not doing so. The law was first signed by President John O. Roberts in his capacity as chief justice of the court's four Democratic members. Mr. Obama and Congressional Democrats are celebrating the legislative achievement of Mr. Obama's presidency. The Affordable Care Act's requirement that certain individuals pay a financial penalty for not obtaining health insurance may reasonably be characterized as a tax. 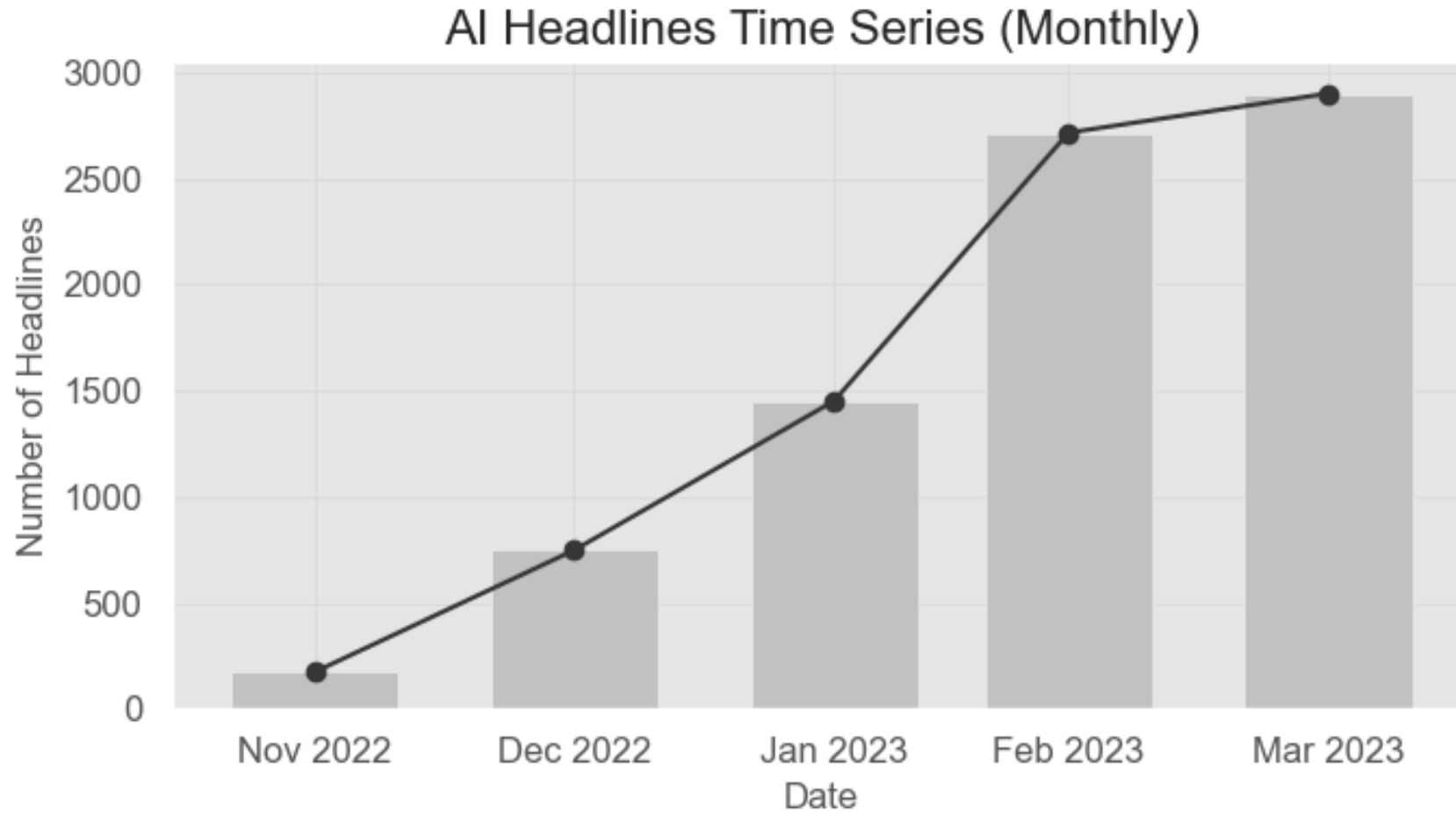

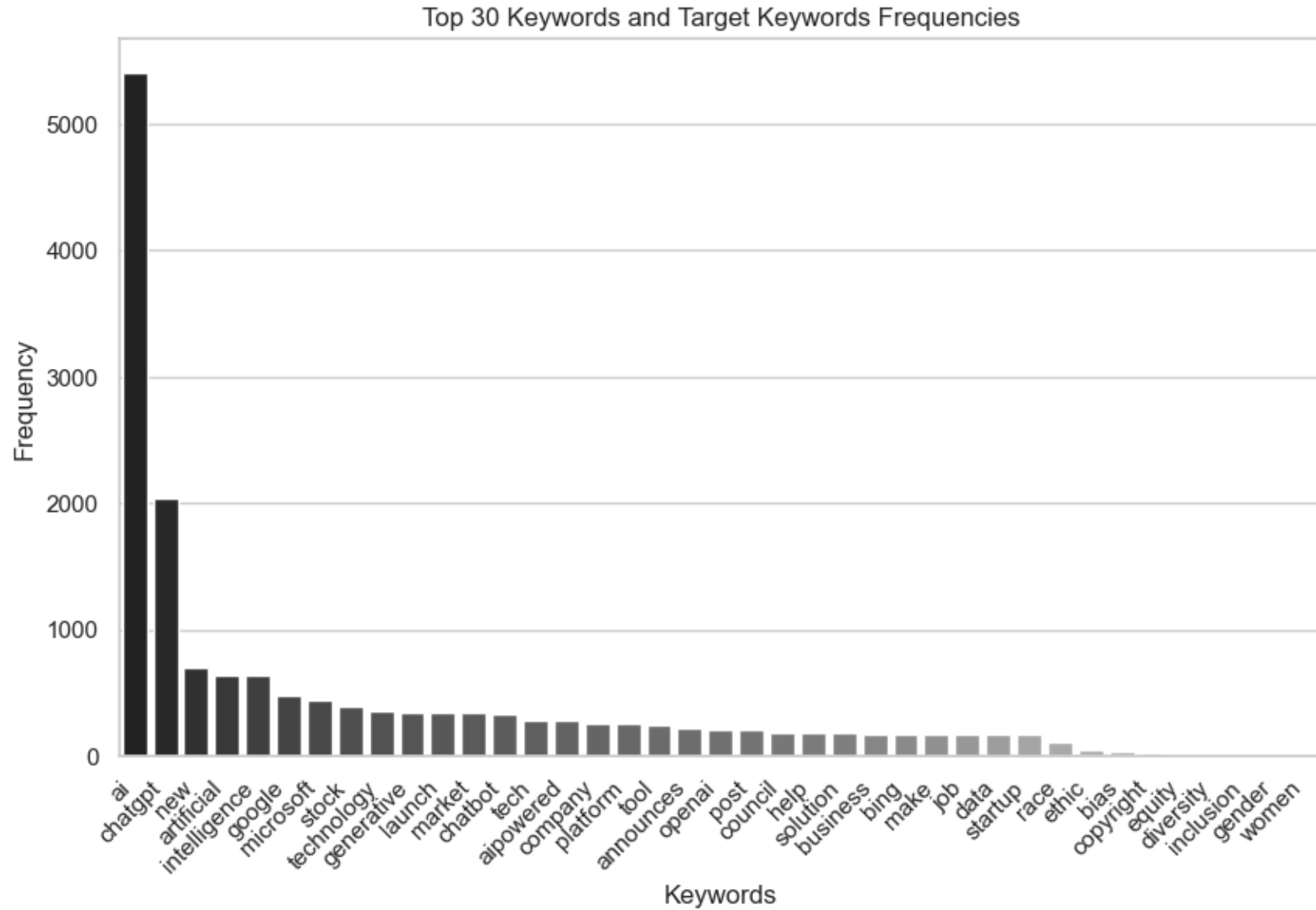

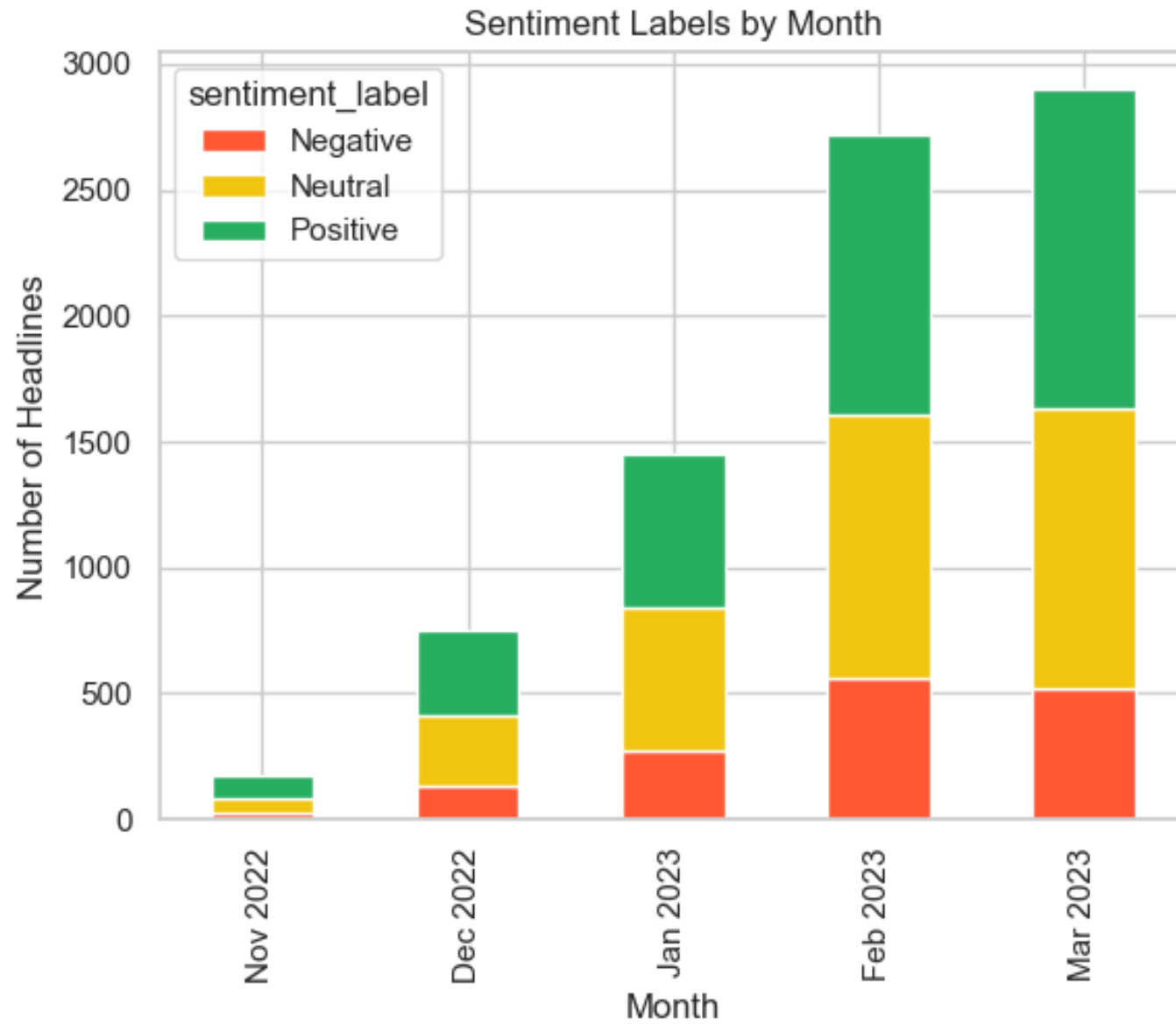
Bar plot of AI news headline occurrences per month



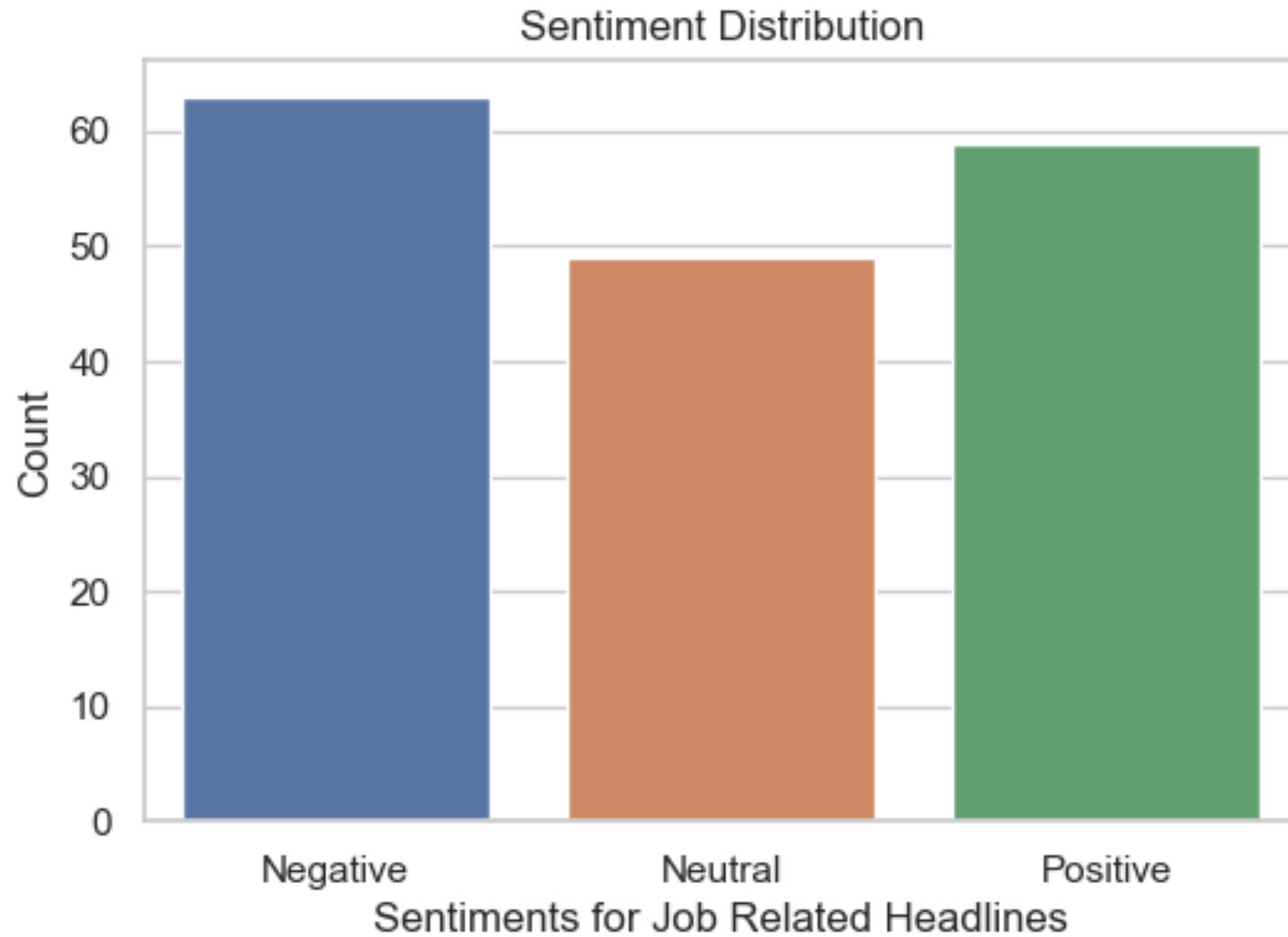
Top thirty word frequency table with additional keywords
