



BLCS travelling and volunteering abroad

Mauryah Burattini is not the only member of the Brock Leaders Citizenship society to travel to Africa - Brittany Van Dyken also had the opportunity to experience volunteering in this country!

Brittany travelled to Cape Town, South Africa this past summer for two weeks in August. She worked with an organization called "African Impact" that provides multi-faceted relief to the surrounding area. "I was very interested in travelling abroad and giving back to the global community," She says. Cape Town and its surrounding area are rich in culture and beauty, but also with poverty and hunger. Brittany was involved in a number of programs, with a focus on children and creating healthy, happy, and safe learning and home environments for them. According to Brittany, her two favourite programs were the HOKISA HIV House, where she played with and taught children affected in some aspect by HIV/AIDS, and The Capricorn Feeding Project which fed breakfast to over one hundred children every day who otherwise would not eat. She would recommend this experience to anyone.

BLCS on a global scale

Adam and Olivia are going to volunteer in the Savusavu Medical Clinic in Fiji over the winter holiday break. It will be their second time going to volunteer. Savusavu is a region on one of the Fijian islands, including a town and many small surrounding villages.

Olivia and Adam are collecting medical supplies and eyeglasses to bring with them. The doctors in Savusavu have a difficult time getting the equipment and supplies they need - often they do not have the money, and many companies will not ship products to the island. Last year, Olivia collected over \$5,000 worth of equipment to bring to the clinic and hospital in the area. She also brought 1,000 pairs of eyeglasses. There are no eye clinics or places to buy glasses anywhere on this island, so many people live with limited eyesight. Cataracts are also a huge problem, preventing fishermen from working to provide for their families, so this year they will be trying to collect sunglasses as well as prescription glasses. Way to go, Olivia and Adam!
