If you choose to celebrate Halloween, remember to respect your community, your neighbours and local by-laws.

IF YOU ARE CAUGHT...	IT WILL COST YOU...
Allow, cause, or permit a Nuisance Party* on any premises while in rightful possession of or possessory control of the premises	\$300 fine
Creating excessive noise (e.g., music, shouting) especially between 11 pm and 7 am	Up to \$300 fine (Local By-law)
Obstructing an officer, including failing to identify	\$1000 - \$5,000 fine (Local By-law)
Trespassing and other property offences	\$50 to \$10,000 fine and possible arrest (Trespass to Property Act)
Liquor Offenses, including the sale of alcohol at your party	\$50 to \$100,000 fine Arrest (Liquor License Act)
Driving under the influence	Various outcomes including arrest & incarceration (Highway Traffic Act)
Leaving, throwing, or depositing any bottles, glasses or other materials on public or private property	\$300 fine (Local By-law)
Urinating, defecating, spitting, or vomiting in public	Up to \$300 (Local By-law)

As Halloween approaches, we are mindful that the actions of students living in our community reflect on the whole student population. As a resident of your community, you are required to follow local bylaws, and are encouraged to be respectful of your neighbors and party safely if celebrating Halloween.

In addition to caring for our communities, we want our students to care for each other. If you believe someone is experiencing an overdose, alcohol poisoning or other medical emergency, call 911.
