Learning Services Tutors will provide one-on-one academic support to Brock University students, as well as community clients. The tutor will meet with students at a pre-arranged date and time and will assist the student in understanding the course material/curriculum, while complying with academic integrity standards. In-person tutoring sessions are held on the Brock campus in Learning Services, TH 129; online sessions are currently delivered using Microsoft Teams.

We seek well-rounded students, who are open to tutoring both in-person, online, and with community clients, though this is not a requirement. An up-to-date vulnerable sector clearance is required to work with underage community clients, which can be acquired after joining the tutoring team.

- Demonstrated enthusiasm and aptitude for teaching and learning
