Through our comprehensive Off-Campus Living listing site you can find rooms, houses or apartments for rent; find or post sublets; or even find or post for housemates.


We know this year has been very difficult in so many ways, particularly financially. We want to focus on two features on our website "Sublets" and "Need Accomodation" that may help you.

IF YOU ARE CAUGHT...	IT COULD COST YOU...
Hosting, organizing a party/gathering/ event contrary to current COVID-19 guidelines*	\$10,000
Attending a party/gathering/event*	\$750
Creating excessive noise (e.g., music, shouting) especially between 11pm and 7am	Up to \$300
Loitering in a public place	\$250
Urinating, defecating, spitting, or vomiting in public	Up to \$300
Trespassing	Up to \$10,000

*With COVID-19, anything can happen. Be aware that provincial and municipal restrictions can change at any time. Visit your local and provincial websites to find the latest public health measures, advice, and restrictions in your area as we continue to navigate COVID-19.

This is not a legal document and is intended to inform Brock University students of potential consequences for breaking the law. Information was taken from the Criminal Code, Niagara Region By-laws, Provincial Offences Act, The City of Thorold By-Law, The City of St. Catharines By-Law, the Ontario Ministry of Transportation and the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario. Please refer to the city you live in for full descriptions of the local by-laws.
