Subject: Report of the Vice Provost, Teaching and Learning

Centre for Pedagogical Innovation

- Educational Technologies
 - Brightspace
 - Participate in the <u>Brightspace Transition Survey</u>: Brock faculty and instructors are invited to share their feedback on the transition from Sakai to Brightspace, the University's learning management system (LMS).  - Status Updates to Course Sites: Students now have access to all past Brightspace course sites unless a site has been made inactive by its instructor. Course sites were previously hidden from students based on the End Date found in Course Offering Information. This was drawn from the official timetable information. In response to instructor and student concerns regarding retaining access to past

- courses, as well as improved pedagogical practice, we are updating the student role to see all past courses.
- Important Dates in Brightspace: During the Fall/Winter Term the Office of the Registrar and Enrolment Services, the Faculty of Social Sciences and the CPI conducted a pilot to streamline communications for first-year students and share information. This pilot will not continue in exactly this form but has led to an enhancement to Brightspace for the whole Brock community. This Spring all important dates referenced in the FHB will be added to the "global" Calendar in Brightspace, e.g., when the University is closed or the last day to withdraw without academic penalty.
