Subject: Report of the Vice Provost, Teaching and Learning

Thank you for the opportunity to provide a regular report to the members of T&LPC. The following is a summary of relevant activities between October 13 and November 16, 2023:

Centre for Pedagogical Innovation

- Tribute to Teaching
 - Members of Senate Teaching and Learning Policy are invited to join this celebration of teaching on the morning of December 7, 2023 in the Pond Inlet, 10:30am-12pm. Brockwide teaching awards will be conferred.
- Webinar Series on Assessment

- Educational Technologies
 - Getting in touch with CPI through Brightspace: Instructors can now search Brock University's Brightspace knowledge base and contact CPI directly from a widget in the bottom right of the Brightspace homepage.
 - A motion that recommends the replacement or renewal of Brock University's online Student Course Experience Survey system along with a report has been submitted to Senate IT&I committee for their November 16, 2023 meeting.
 - CPI is working on the replacement or renewal of Brock University's "phrase matching software," Turnitin. <u>A survey has been circulated through Brightspace, the Teaching and</u> Learning Newsletter, and other locations.
 - Brock University's transition to the YuJa video platform is almost complete. Over 40,000 videos and captions have been imported from Echo360 and distributed to instructors and TAs. Instructors should now see their August 2023 and earlier Echo360 videos in their YuJa library. Echo360 videos are being re-embedded in Brightspace with their YuJa versions now. Access to update Echo360 will end in November.

Co-op, Career, and Experiential Education (CCEE)

- Co-op Professional Preparation Course (N90)
 - Over 400 students (Arts & Sciences and Business) in the Co-op Professional Preparation course engaged in two in-person learning simulations during the first week of November to practice networking skills. 25 senior co-op students volunteered for the simulation and provided students a lower risk opportunity to test their skills in a professional setting and to prepare them for future networking events with industry representatives. On Nov 6 over 60 graduate co-op students interacted with industry professionals across 11 different companies and organizations to learn about careers and job opportunities in a variety of fields.

- Experiential Education Highlight:
 - Dr. Laura Cousens, the EE Faculty Champion in Applied Health Sciences, is continuing her efforts to provide valuable leadership opportunities in the sport industry to upper year students in the program via the departments major games course (SPMA 4P98). 46 students are enrolled in the major games class which is focused on Canadian Football Championship events. The 2023 Grey Cup and Festival is being held in Hamilton, Ontario beginning November 12th, 2023. Brock's sport management students will be taking on leadership roles during festival events in the week leading up to game day and will also work with event management professionals for the half time show as well as executives from the Canadian Football League head office for various corporate activations. The vast majority of these students have also applied for and received funding via Brock's iHub Bursary Program to provide them with funds to cover the costs associated with travelling back and forth to Hamilton each day during this experience.
