

MEOPAR Shoreline Options Values Survey Results



Through a virtual focus group and on-line survey, researchers on the MEOPAR-Lincoln Community Sustainability Project have compiled results from participants on options for enhancing shoreline protection in the Town of Lincoln. These were reflective of what participants felt were most important, and of the values that each option represented to them. The answers received were clustered into three groupings (green, silver, and grey) and listed with their corresponding values below.

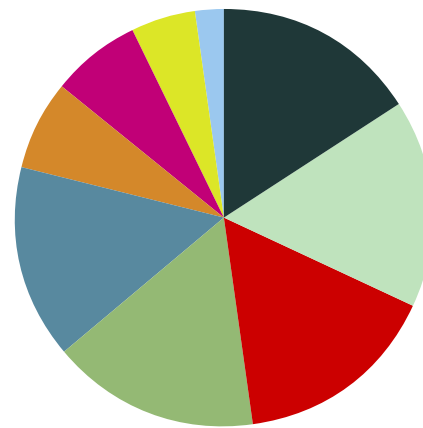
