

Enrichment Program Instructors

If you enjoy working with youth who have just completed grades 3 - 8, have a sense of fun and excitement, and enjoy providing adventurous educational opportunities, then Youth University is the place for you! We are looking for a bright and energetic Enrichment Program Instructors!

Enrichment Program Instructors are responsible for teaching educational modules in various disciplines, including science, technology, humanities and outdoor education. Using prepared lesson plans, Instructors are responsible for preparing themselves to teach approximately 4 hours of class daily to 12 - 15 youth. When students are not engaged in learning activities, Instructors are responsible for running recreational activities, including cooperative games and swimming. Staff will be engaged with and monitor students during lunch and recreation and will assist with monitoring students during extended care in the morning and afternoon. Summer Enrichment Program Instructors also assist with opening and closing ceremonies and are required to attend a weekly staff meeting.

Our Enrichment Program Instructors are responsible for maintaining a safe environment, both physically and emotionally for all students and will create a meaningful and fun experience for all involved. They also demonstrate a positive and energetic personality, excellent communication skills, a love for working with children, and a willingness to represent Brock in a highly professional manner.

Enrichment Program Instructors will report to the Summer Camp Coordinator and a Program Manager.

Program Instructors must be available to work from July 1st - August 30th 2013, with mandatory training happening between June 24th and 28th, 2013.

Salary range is \$3420 - \$3532 for the summer (based on the completion of 9 weeks of camp). Includes all mandatory training sessions prior to the beginning of camp and vacation pay.

The ideal candidate will be flexible with the ability to work long hours. Excellent communication, conflict resolution, organizational skills and an openness to feedback are necessary. Standard First Aid & CPR "C" certification as well as a current police clearance is required prior to the first day of program. Teaching experience, experience with summer camp programs, leading programs for youth and community groups, work with special needs populations and experience in program planning and administration are assets.
